A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state building
- 2 code council was created in 2007 to review and adopt current,
- 3 nationally recognized building codes and standards for the
- 4 State. However, the staff and operating expenses of the council
- 5 have never been funded, thereby limiting the effectiveness of
- 6 the work of the nine voting members.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to add building industry and
- 8 trade representatives to the council membership, allow
- 9 staggering of the code adoption, define and clarify terminology,
- 10 ensure that no code provisions that conflict with the laws
- 11 governing contractors are adopted, and appropriate funds to the
- 12 department of accounting and general services for the council's
- 13 operating costs.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 107-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended as follows:
- 1. By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 17 inserted and to read:

1 ""Codes and standards" means nationally recognized minimum 2 requirements that shall be met for design and construction to 3 safeguard life, property, and the general welfare. "Hawaii state building codes" means the building codes and 4 5 standards that the state building code council adopts under 6 section 107-24." 7 2. By amending the definition of "hurricane resistive 8 criteria" to read: 9 ""Hurricane [resistive] resistant criteria" means the 10 design criteria for enhanced hurricane protection areas that are 11 capable of withstanding a five hundred-year hurricane event, as 12 developed by the state department of defense for public shelter 13 and residential safe room design criteria." 14 SECTION 3. Section 107-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 16 "(a) There is established a state building code council. 17 The council shall be placed within the department of accounting 18 and general services for administrative purposes only. 19 council shall consist of [nine] eleven voting members and one 20 nonvoting member, who shall be the comptroller or the

         SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
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    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $ or so much

    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
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    state building code council and staff to carry out their duties
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    and functions, including operating costs and staff salaries.
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         The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
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    accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
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- 1 SECTION 12. This Act does not affect rights and duties
- 2 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 3 were begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Modifies the composition, quorum, and duties of the Hawaii state building code council and revises the state building code, including clarifying terminology, the code adoption process, and the staggering of code adoptions. Prohibits the state building code council from adopting provisions in the Hawaii state building codes that conflict with laws governing contractors. Appropriates unspecified funds to department of accounting and general services for council's operating costs, including staff salaries. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)
