A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 26-14.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§26-14.6 Department of public safety. (a) The
4 department of public safety shall be headed by a single
5 executive to be known as the director of public safety.

6 (b) The department of public safety shall be responsible 7 for the formulation and implementation of state policies and 8 objectives for correctional, security, law enforcement, and 9 public safety programs and functions, for the administration and 10 maintenance of all public or private correctional facilities and 11 services, for the service of process, and for the security of 12 state buildings.

13 (c) Effective July 1, 1990, the Hawaii paroling authority
14 and the crime victim compensation commission are placed within
15 the department of public safety for administrative purposes
16 only.

17 (d) Effective July 1, 1990, the functions and authority18 heretofore exercised by:

12 Effective July 1, 1999, the functions and authority (h) 13 heretofore exercised by the director of public safety and the 14 department of public safety relating to after hours security 15 contracts at department of education facilities, except for the 16 security functions being performed by employees of the public 17 library system as well as the contractual security services for 18 the libraries, shall be transferred to the department of 19 education.

20 (i) Effective January 1, 1993, the functions and authority
21 heretofore exercised by the director of health and the
22 department of health relating to uniformed security employees
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1 and security contracts at various state hospitals throughout the 2 State shall be transferred to the department of public safety. 3 Effective July 1, 2005, the functions, authority, and employee positions of the department of public safety relating to 4 5 uniformed security employees and security contracts at health 6 facilities that are under the operation, management, and control 7 of the Hawaii health systems corporation shall be transferred to 8 the Hawaii health systems corporation.

9 (j) Effective January 1, 1993, the functions and authority
10 heretofore exercised by the director of human services and the
11 department of human services relating to contractual security
12 guard services shall be transferred to the department of public
13 safety.

14 (k) Effective July 1, 1994, the functions and authority
15 heretofore exercised by the adjutant general relating to
16 security for national guard and state civil defense facilities
17 in the Diamond Head complex, for after work hours, shall be
18 transferred to the department of public safety.

19 (1) Effective July 1, 2002, the functions and authority
20 heretofore exercised by the director of public safety and the
21 department of public safety relating to after hours security
22 contracts at department of education facilities, including all





1 security functions being performed by employees of the public 2 library system, as well as the contractual security services for 3 the libraries, shall be transferred to the department of 4 education and the public library system as appropriate. 5 (m) Effective July 1, 2016, the functions and authority 6 exercised by the director of transportation relating to harbors 7 law enforcement shall be transferred to the department of public 8 safety." 9 SECTION 2. Section 26-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "§26-19 Department of transportation. The department of 12 transportation shall be headed by a single executive to be known 13 as the director of transportation. The department shall 14 establish, maintain, and operate transportation facilities of 15 the State, including highways, airports, harbors, and such other 16 transportation facilities and activities as may be authorized by 17 law. 18 The department shall plan, develop, promote, and coordinate

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1	The department shall develop and promote ridesharing		
2	programs which shall include but not be limited to, carpool and		
3	vanpool programs, and may assist organizations interested in

6	in the formulation of ridesharing arrangements. Ridesharing		
7	programs include informal arrangements in which two or more		
8	persons ride together in a motor vehicle.		
9	The functions and authority heretofore exercised by the		
10	department of public works with respect to highways are		
11	transferred to the department of transportation established by		
12	this chapter.		
13	No later than July 1, 2016, the harbors law enforcement		
14	functions of the department of transportation shall be		
15	transferred to the department of public safety.		
16	On July 1, 1961, the Hawaii aeronautics commission, the		
17	board of harbor commissioners and the highway commission shall		
18	be abolished and their remaining functions, duties, and powers		
19	shall be transferred to the department of transportation."		
20	SECTION 3. Section 353C-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
21	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		



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1 "(a) The director may appoint employees to be public 2 safety officers who shall have all of the powers of police 3 officers; provided that the director may establish and assign 4 the employees to positions or categories of positions that may 5 have differing titles, specific duties, and limitations upon the 6 exercise of police powers [-]; provided further that all officers 7 assigned to carry out law enforcement functions at state harbors 8 shall meet the qualifications established for sheriffs of the 9 department."

SECTION 4. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of the department of transportation, harbors division related to law enforcement, except those of the state harbors civil violations system, are transferred to the department of public safety.

All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose 15 functions are transferred to the department of public safety by 16 this Act shall retain their civil service status, whether 17 18 permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred without 19 loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by applicable 20 collective bargaining agreements), retention points, prior 21 service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits previously 22 earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges, in



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
1 accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided that 2 the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public 3 employment requirements for the class or position to which 4 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that 5 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable 6 civil service and compensation laws.

7 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil 8 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may 9 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed 10 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An 11 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer 12 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits 13 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a 14 consequence of this Act; provided that the employee possesses 15 legal and public employment requirements for the position to 16 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further 17 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to 18 applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of 19 public safety may prescribe the duties and qualifications of 20 these employees and fix their salaries without regard to chapter 21 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

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1 SECTION 5. All appropriations, records, equipment, 2 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, 3 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, 4 acquired, or held by the department of transportation relating 5 to the functions transferred to the department of public safety 6 shall be transferred with the functions to which they relate. 7 SECTION 6. The director of public safety, in cooperation 8 with the director of transportation shall submit a report to the 9 legislature, including findings, recommendations, and updates on 10 the transference of functions and authority of harbors law 11 enforcement from the department of transportation to the department of public safety, no later than twenty days prior to 12 13 the convening of the regular session of 2016. 14 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 15 16 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
