A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the consumption of
- 2 alcohol or certain prescription medications can impair the
- 3 judgment and physical response of a law enforcement officer.
- 4 The legislature also finds that it is important to establish a
- 5 high standard and criteria regarding the consumption of alcohol
- 6 and certain prescription medications in order to ensure the
- 7 safety of everyone in the State.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit state and county law
- 9 enforcement officers from consuming alcohol or prescription
- 10 medications that can mentally or physically impair their
- 11 judgment while carrying a firearm.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 26-14.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "\$26-14.6 Department of public safety. (a) The
- 15 department of public safety shall be headed by a single
- 16 executive to be known as the director of public safety.
- 17 (b) The department of public safety shall be responsible

10	(d) Effective July 1, 1990, the functions and authority

12	(1) The department of corrections relating to adult
13	corrections and the intake service centers;
14	(2) The judiciary relating to the sheriff's office and
15	judiciary security personnel; and
16	(3) The department of the attorney general relating to

- 3 SECTION 3. Section 26-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "\$26-15 Department of land and natural resources. (a)
- 6 The department of land and natural resources shall be headed by
- 7 an executive board to be known as the board of land and natural
- 8 resources, except for matters relating to the state water code
- 9 where the commission on water resource management shall have
- 10 exclusive jurisdiction and final authority.
- 11 The board shall consist of seven members, one from each
- 12 land district and three at large. The appointment, tenure, and
- 13 removal of the members and the filling of vacancies on the board
- 14 shall be as provided in section 26-34. At least one member of
- 15 the board shall have a background in conservation and natural
- 16 resources, as provided in section 171-4.
- 17 The governor shall appoint the chairperson of the board
- 18 from among the members thereof.
- 19 The board may delegate to the chairperson such duties,
- 20 powers, and authority, or so much thereof, as may be lawful or
- 21 proper for the performance of the functions vested in the board.

1 The chairperson of the board shall serve in a full-time 2 capacity. The chairperson, in that capacity, shall perform 3 those duties, and exercise those powers and authority, or so 4 much thereof, as may be delegated by the board. 5 The department shall manage and administer the public 6 lands of the State and minerals thereon and all water and 7 coastal areas of the State except the commercial harbor areas of 8 the State, including the soil conservation function, the forests 9 and forest reserves, aquatic life, wildlife resources, state parks, including historic sites, and all activities thereon and **10** 11 therein including, but not limited to, boating, ocean 12 recreation, and coastal areas programs. 13 The functions and authority heretofore exercised by 14 the commissioner and board of public lands (including the 15 hydrography division and the bureau of conveyances), the Hawaii water authority, the commission on ground water resources, the 16 17 Hawaii land development authority, the soil conservation 18 committee, and the commission on historical sites and the 19 function of managing the state parks and the function of promoting the conservation, development and utilization of 20 21 forests, including the regulatory powers over the forest 22 reserve, aquatic life and wildlife resources of the State SB LRB 14-0258-1.doc

- 5 (d) Effective July 1, 2014, no department of land and

- 8 any alcohol within hours prior to carrying a firearm.
- 9 (e) Effective July 1, 2014, no department of land and
- 10 natural resources employee authorized to carry a firearm shall
- 11 carry a firearm after ingesting any prescription medication that
- 12 would impair the judgment or physical response of the employee
- 13 while carrying a firearm."
- 14 SECTION 4. Section 26-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$26-19 Department of transportation. (a) The department
- 17 of transportation shall be headed by a single executive to be
- 18 known as the director of transportation. The department shall
- 19 establish, maintain, and operate transportation facilities of
- 20 the State, including highways, airports, harbors, and such other
- 21 transportation facilities and activities as may be authorized by
- 22 law.

1 The department shall plan, develop, promote, and (b) 2 coordinate various transportation systems management programs 3 that shall include, but not be limited to, alternate work and 4 school hours programs, bicycling programs, and ridesharing 5 programs. 6 The department shall develop and promote ridesharing 7 programs which shall include but not be limited to, carpool and 8 vanpool programs, and may assist organizations interested in 9 promoting similar programs, arrange for contracts with private 10 organizations to manage and operate these programs, and assist 11 in the formulation of ridesharing arrangements. Ridesharing 12 programs include informal arrangements in which two or more 13 persons ride together in a motor vehicle. 14 The functions and authority heretofore exercised by 15 the department of public works with respect to highways are 16 transferred to the department of transportation established by 17 this chapter. 18 (e) On July 1, 1961, the Hawaii aeronautics commission, 19 the board of harbor commissioners and the highway commission 20 shall be abolished and their remaining functions, duties, and

powers shall be transferred to the department of transportation.

1 Effective July 1, 2014, no department of (f) transportation employee authorized to carry a firearm shall 2 3 consume any alcohol while carrying a firearm or have consumed 4 any alcohol within hours prior to carrying a firearm. 5 (g) Effective July 1, 2014, no department of 6 transportation employee authorized to carry a firearm shall 7 carry a firearm after ingesting any prescription medication that 8 would impair the judgment or physical response of the employee 9 while carrying a firearm." **10** SECTION 5. Section 52D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: "[+] \$52D-6[+] Police force; employees. (a) The chief of 12 13 police may appoint officers and other employees under such rules 14 and at such salaries as are authorized by law. Probationary 15 appointment, suspension, and dismissal of officers and employees 16 of the police department shall be as authorized by law. 17 (b) Effective July 1, 2014, no police department officer 18 or employee authorized to carry a firearm shall consume any 19 alcohol while carrying a firearm or have consumed any alcohol 20 within hours prior to carrying a firearm. 21 (c) Effective July 1, 2014, no police department officer 22 or employee authorized to carry a firearm shall carry a firearm

- 1 after ingesting any prescription medication that would impair
- 2 the judgment or physical response of the officer or employee
- 3 while carrying a firearm."
- 4 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Firearms; Law Enforcement Officers; Alcohol; Prescription Medications

Description:

Prohibits state and county law enforcement officers who are authorized to carry firearms from consuming alcohol or ingesting prescription medications that would impair the judgment or physical response of the employee while carrying a firearm. Prohibits the consumption of alcohol for an unspecified number of hours prior to carrying a firearm.
