A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD ABUSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that due to a lack of
- 2 dedicated resources, only about two per cent of known child
- 3 exploitation offenders are being investigated. Alicia's Law is
- 4 an initiative that builds state capacity to combat crimes
- 5 against children by seeking funding for internet crimes against
- 6 children task forces. Alicia's Law was named for Alicia
- 7 Kozakiewicz, who was abducted by an internet predator and
- 8 sexually abused.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to create a special fund
- **10** dedicated to investigating and prosecuting child pornographers
- 11 and other perpetrators of internet facilitated crimes against
- 12 children, to promote education on internet safety to the public
- 13 and to minors, to rescue child victims from abuse and
- 14 exploitation, and to require the attorney general to submit a
- 15 report to the legislature.
- 16 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- **17** adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 18 as follows:

Report Title:

Internet Crimes Against Children Fund; Department of the Attorney General; Alicia's Law

Description:

Establishes an internet crimes against children fee for each felony or misdemeanor conviction. Requires deposit of the fees into an internet crimes against children special fund to provide training and resources for local law enforcement agencies' and investigators' use in investigating and prosecuting internet crimes against children. Requires the attorney general to submit a report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2015.
