A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that unmanned aircraft 1 technology is rapidly developing. Public Law 112-95 (2012) 2 requires the Federal Aviation Administration to "accelerate the 3 integration of civil unmanned aircraft systems into the national 4 airspace system". While unmanned aircraft technology offers 5 more efficient and cost saving methods to gather information, 6 this new and innovative technology may also provide 7 opportunities for abuse. 8 In recognizing the progressive opportunities that unmanned 9 aircrafts provide, the legislature also recognizes its duty to 10
 - aircrafts provide, the legislature also recognizes its duty to protect Hawaii residents from threats to their constitutional right to privacy. The legislature further finds that in 2013 nine other states passed legislation regulating government deployment of unmanned aircraft technology.
- The purpose of this Act is to ensure that unmanned aircraft technology is used strictly to assist or benefit Hawaii
 residents and not used in a manner that will impede their right
- 18 to privacy.

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1	SECTION 2. Chapter 803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read as follows:
4	"PART . UNMANNED AIRCRAFTS
5	§803-A Definitions. As used in this part unless otherwise
6	required by context:
7	"Law enforcement agency" means any agency of the State,
8	county, or United States that is vested by law with the duty to
9	maintain public order and to enforce the criminal laws.
10	"Unmanned aircraft" means an aircraft that is operated
11	without direct human intervention onboard the aircraft.
12	§803-B Use of unmanned aircrafts prohibited. Except as
13	provided under this part, it shall be unlawful for any law
14	enforcement agency, state or local public agency, person, or
15	entity to use an unmanned aircraft to gather information,
16	including but not limited to images, photographs, or recordings.
17	§803-C Exceptions. This part shall not apply to a law
18	enforcement agency under any of the following circumstances:
19	(1) A finding based on credible intelligence is made by
20	the United States Secretary of Homeland Security that
21	the use of an unmanned aircraft is necessary to

1		counter a high risk terrorist attack by a specific
2		individual or organization;
3	(2)	A search warrant is issued pursuant to this chapter
4		that permits the use of an unmanned aircraft; provided
5		that the search warrant shall be valid for a period
6		not to exceed thirty days but may be extended by the
7		court for no more than thirty additional days upon a
8		showing of good cause;
9	(3)	The use of an unmanned aircraft is necessary to assist
10		in search and rescue activities or locate missing
11		persons;
12	(4)	The use of an unmanned aircraft is necessary to assist
13		in the operation, exercise, or mission of any branch
14		of the United States military; or
15	(5)	The use of an unmanned aircraft is necessary to assist
16		the disaster relief agency under chapter 127 or
17		provide relief pursuant to the governor's declaration
18		of a state disaster under section 209-2.
19	§803-	-D Retention of information. If a law enforcement
20	agency use	es an unmanned aircraft pursuant to section 803-C, the
21	law enfor	cement agency shall destroy all information collected
22	by the uni	manned aircraft no later than thirty days after such
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information is collected unless the information is necessary for 1 2 and relevant to an ongoing criminal investigation or pending 3 criminal trial. 4 §803-E Disclosure of information. If a law enforcement 5 agency uses an unmanned aircraft pursuant to section 803-C, the 6 law enforcement agency shall not disclose any information 7 collected by the unmanned aircraft unless the collected information is necessary for and relevant to an ongoing criminal 8 9 investigation or pending criminal trial. §803-F Remedies for violations. An aggrieved party may 10 initiate a civil action to: 11 12 (1) Obtain any appropriate relief, including but not 13 limited to equitable relief to prevent or remedy a 14 violation of this part; and 15 (2) Recover monetary damages, including actual and general 16 damages, attorney's fees, and other litigation costs 17 reasonably incurred, in an amount no less than \$1,000; 18 or19 (3) If information collected through the use of an 20 unmanned aircraft was publicly disclosed without the 21 aggrieved party's permission, the aggrieved party is 22 entitled to recover monetary damages, including actual

1		and general damages, attorney's fees, and other
2		litigation costs reasonably incurred, in an amount no
3		less than \$10,000.
4	\$803	-G Reporting. (a) In January of each year, any law
5	enforceme	nt agency that used an unmanned aircraft during the
6	previous	calendar year shall report to the legislature its
7	unmanned	aircraft activities and shall provide a copy of the
8	report to	the judiciary. The report shall include the following
9	informati	on:
10	(1)	The number of times an unmanned aircraft was used,
11		organized by the types of incidents and the types of
12		justification for deployment;
13	(2)	The number of crime investigations aided by the use of
14		each unmanned aircraft, along with a description of
15		how the unmanned aircraft was helpful to each
16		investigation; and
17	(3)	The total cost of the law enforcement agency's
18	•	unmanned aircraft program.
19	(b)	In January of each year, any court that has issued a
20	search wa	rrant permitting the use of an unmanned aircraft, an
21	extension	or modification of such warrant, or denied an
22	applicati	on for such warrant during the previous calendar year
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- 1 shall report to the judiciary the number, kind, and duration of
- 2 search warrants or search warrant extensions applied for,
- 3 granted, modified, or denied."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 8 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 9 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 10 the new sections in this Act.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Unmanned Aircrafts; Right to Privacy

Description:

Prohibits the use of unmanned aircrafts, except by law enforcement agencies, to gather information and establishes certain conditions for law enforcement agencies to use an unmanned aircraft to obtain information. Requires all law enforcement agencies using unmanned aircrafts and the courts to report on their activities relating to unmanned aircrafts. (SD1)

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
