A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: **"§387-2 Minimum wages.** (a) Except as provided in section 3 387-9 and this section, every employer shall pay to each 4 employee employed by the employer, wages at the rate of not less 5 6 than: 7 (1)\$6.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2003; \$6.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2006; [and] 8 (2) \$7.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2007[-]; 9 (3) \$7.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2015; 10 (4)(5) \$8.50 per hour beginning January 1, 2016; 11 \$9.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2017; and 12 (6) \$10.10 per hour beginning January 1, 2018. 13 (7) The hourly wage of a tipped employee may be deemed to 14 (b) be increased on account of tips if the employee is paid not less 15 16 than: (1) 25 cents;

- 1 (3) 75 cents per hour beginning January 1, 2016,
- 2 below the applicable minimum wage by the employee's employer and
- 3 the combined amount the employee receives from the employee's

- 6 2015, the combined amount the employee receives from the
- 7 employee's employer and in tips is at least \$7.00 more than the

Labor; Minimum Wage; Tip Credit

Description:

Increases minimum wage rate to \$7.75 per hour beginning on 1/1/15, \$8.50 per hour beginning on 1/1/16, \$9.25 per hour beginning on 1/1/17, and \$10.10 per hour beginning on 1/1/18. Increases the tip credit to 50 cents per hour beginning on 1/1/15, and 75 cents per hour beginning on 1/1/16; provided that beginning 1/1/15, the combined amount the employee receives in wages and tips is at least \$7 more than the applicable minimum wage. (CD1)
