A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§387-2 Minimum wages. (a) Except as provided in section 4 387-9 and this section, every employer shall pay to each 5 employee employed by the employer, wages at the rate of not less 6 than: \$6.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2003; 7 (1)\$6.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2006; [and] (2) 9 (3) \$7.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2007[-]; 10 \$7.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2015; (4)11 (5) \$8.50 per hour beginning January 1, 2016; 12 \$9.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2017; and (6) 13 (7) \$10.00 per hour beginning January 1, 2018. 14 The hourly wage of a tipped employee may be deemed to (b) 15 be increased on account of tips if the employee is paid not less 16 than: (1) 25 cents;

- 18 50 cents per hour beginning January 1, 2015; and SB2609 HD2 HMS 2014-3145

- 1 (3) 75 cents per hour beginning January 1, 2016,
- 2 below the applicable minimum wage by the employee's employer and
- 3 the combined amount the employee receives from the employee's
- 4 employer and in tips is at least 50 cents more than the
- 5 applicable minimum wage[-]; provided that beginning January 1,
- 6 2015, the combined amount the employee receives from the
- 7 employee's employer and in tips is at least \$7.00 more than the
- 8 applicable minimum wage."
- 9 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Labor; Minimum Wage; Tip Credit

Description:

Increases minimum wage rate to \$7.75 per hour beginning on 1/1/15, \$8.50 per hour beginning on 1/1/16, \$9.25 per hour beginning on 1/1/17, and \$10.00 per hour beginning on 1/1/18. Increases the tip credit to 50 cents per hour beginning on 1/1/15, and 75 cents per hour beginning on 1/1/16; provided that beginning 1/1/15, the combined amount the employee receives in wages and tips is at least \$7 more than the applicable minimum wage. (SB2609 HD2)
