RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 286-116, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

(d) The operation of any motor vehicle required to be 1 licensed on a highway by a driver, whether or not licensed, who 2 knows, or has reason to believe, that the motor vehicle is not 3 insured in compliance with article 10C and article 10G of 4 chapter 431, shall constitute a violation of this chapter. 5 6 (e) Any registered owner of any motor vehicle required to be licensed, who directly or indirectly permits the operation of 7 8 such motor vehicle on any highway at any time the motor vehicle 9 is not insured in compliance with article 10C and article 10G of 10 chapter 431, shall be quilty of a violation of this chapter. The registered owner shall, in all cases, be presumed to know 11 12 whether a motor vehicle is insured in compliance with article 13 10C and article 10G of chapter 431. 14 (f) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if a person fails to display a valid insurance identification card as 15 16 required under subsection (a), the director of finance, any 17 police officer, or any law enforcement officer may apply or 18 cause to be applied a wheel boot to the motor vehicle. motor vehicle shall be subject to redemption by its owner only 19 20 after paying the applicable charges incident to the booting of the motor vehicle and by showing a valid insurance 21 22 identification card, as required under subsection (a).
