A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOBBYISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 97, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding	a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as f	ollows:
4	" <u>\$</u> 97	- Contributions and expenditures; statement; special
5	session.	(a) The following persons shall file a statement of
6	expenditu	res with the state ethics commission within ten days of
7	sine die	of any special session of the legislature:
8	(1)	Each lobbyist who lobbies ninety days prior to the
9		convening of a special session or through sine die of
10		that special session, or both;
11	(2)	Each person who spends \$750 or more of the person's or
12		any other person's money ninety days prior to the
13		convening of a special session or through sine die of
14		that special session, or both, for the purpose of
15		attempting to influence legislative action or a ballot
16		issue presented to the legislature for consideration
17		during the special session by communicating or urging
18		others to communicate with public officials; provided

1		that any amounts expended for travel costs, including							
2		incidental meals and lodging, shall not be included in							
3		the tallying of the \$750; and							
4	(3)	Each person who employs or contracts for services of							
5	r	one or more lobbyists, whether independently or							
6		jointly with other persons, for the purpose of							
7		attempting to influence legislative action or a ballot							
8		issue presented to the legislature for consideration							
9		ninety days prior to the convening of a special							
10		session or through sine die of that special session,							
11		or both, by communicating or urging others to							
12		communicate with public officials. If the person is							
13		an industry, trade, or professional association, only							
14		the association shall be deemed the employer of the							
15		lobbyist.							
16	<u>(b)</u>	The statement of expenditures shall cover the period							
17	starting	ninety days prior to the convening of a special session							
18	and throu	gh sine die of that special session and applies only to							
19	expenditu	tures and contributions that are related to any							
20	legislati	ve action presented to the legislature for							
21	consideration during that special session of the legislature.								

1	(c) The statement shall contain the following information									
2	related to the expenditures of and contributions for any									
3	legislative action presented to the legislature for									
4	consideration during a special session of the legislature:									
5	(1) The name and address of each person for whom									
6		expenditures for the purpose of lobbying in the total								
7		sum of \$25 or more per day were made by the person								
8		filing the statement during the statement period and								
9		the amount or value of the expenditures;								
10	(2)	The name and address of each person for whom								
11		expenditures for the purpose of lobbying in the								
12		aggregate of \$150 or more were made by the person								
13		filing the statement during the statement period and								
14		the amount or value of the expenditures;								
15	<u>(3)</u>	The total sum or value of all expenditures for the								
16	purpose of lobbying made by the person filing the									
17		statement during the statement period in excess of								
18	\$750;									
19	(4) The name and address of each person making									
20	contributions for the purpose of lobbying to the									
21	person filing the statement in the total sum of \$25									

1		more during the statement period and the amount or								
2	value of the contributions; and									
3	(5)	The subject area of the legislative action that was								
4		supported or opposed by the person filing the								
5		statement during the statement period.								
6	(d)	The receipt or expenditure of any money for the								
7	purpose of influencing the election or defeat of any candidate									
8	for an elective office or for the passage or defeat of any									
9	proposed measure at any special or general election is exclude									
10	from the	reporting requirement of this section."								
11	SECTION 2. Section 97-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is									
12	amended by amending the definition of "lobbyist" to read as									
13	follows:									
14	"(6)	"Lobbyist" means any individual who for pay or other								
15		consideration engages in lobbying in excess of five								
16		hours in any month of any reporting period described								
17		in section 97-3 or spends more than \$750 lobbying								
18		during any reporting period described in section								
19		97-3[-]; or engages in lobbying in excess of five								
20		hours in any month during any statement period of a								
21		special session of the legislature as described in								
22		section 97- or spends more than \$750 lobbying durin								

1	any statement period of a special session of the							
2	legislature as described in section 97"							
3	SECTION 3. Section 97-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is							
4	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:							
5	"(b) The March 31 report shall cover the period from							
6	January 1 through the last day of February. The May 31 report							
7	shall cover the period from March 1 through April 30. The							
8	January 31 report shall cover the period from May 1 through							
9	December 31 of the previous year [-]; provided that any							
10	expenditures and contributions that are related to any							
1	legislative action or ballot issue presented to the legislature							
12	for consideration during a special session of the legislature							
13	shall be filed with the state ethics commission in accordance							
4	with section 97"							
15	SECTION 4. Section 97-4.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is							
6	amended to read as follows:							
17	"[+]§97-4.5[+] Lobbyist list. As soon as is feasible							
8	after the commencement of each regular session or special							
9	session of the legislature, the state ethics commission shall							
20	publish a list of registered lobbyists, the names of the persons							
21	whom they represent, and other pertinent information but shall							
22	not include in such list the addresses of the lobbyists. The

3	SECT:	ION 5. Section 97-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
5	"(a)	The state ethics commission shall administer and
6	implement	this chapter, and shall have the following powers and
7	duties:	
8	(1)	Initiate, receive, and consider charges concerning
9		alleged violations of this chapter, and investigate or
10		cause to be investigated on a confidential basis, the
11		activities of any person to determine whether the
12		person is in compliance with this chapter;
13	. (2)	Prescribe forms for the statements and reports
14		required by sections 97-2 [and], 97-3, and 97- and
15		establish orderly procedures for implementing the
16		requirements of those provisions;
17	(3)	Render advisory opinions upon the request of any
18		person subject to this chapter. If no advisory
19		opinion is rendered within thirty days after the
20		request is filed with the commission, it shall be
21		deemed that an advisory opinion was rendered and that
22		the facts and circumstances of that particular case do

not constitute a violation of this chapter. The
opinion rendered or deemed rendered, until amended or
revoked, shall be binding on the commission in any
subsequent charges concerning the person subject to
this chapter who sought the opinion and acted in
reliance on it in good faith, unless material facts
were omitted or misstated by the person in the request
for an advisory opinion;

- (4) Issue subpoenas, administer oaths, and exercise those powers conferred upon the commission by section 92-16;
- (5) Adopt rules, not inconsistent with this chapter, as in the judgment of the commission seem appropriate for the carrying out of this chapter and for the efficient administration of this chapter, including every matter or thing required to be done or which may be done with the approval or consent or by order or under the direction or supervision of, or as prescribed by, the commission. The rules, when adopted as provided in chapter 91, shall have the force and effect of law; and
- (6) Have jurisdiction for purposes of investigation and taking appropriate action on alleged violations of

1		this chapter in all proceedings commenced within three
2		years of an alleged violation of this chapter. A
3		proceeding shall be deemed commenced by the filing of
4		a charge with the commission or by the signing of a
5		charge by three or more members of the commission.
6		Nothing shall bar proceedings against a person who by
7		fraud or other device prevents discovery of a
8		violation of this chapter."
9	SECT:	ION 6. Section 97-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

12	(1)	Wilfully fails to file any statement or report
13		required by this chapter;
14	(2)	Wilfully files a statement or report containing false
15		information or material omission of any fact;
16	(3)	Engages in activities prohibited by section 97-5; or
17	(4)	Fails to provide information required by section 97-2
18		[or], 97-3[+], or 97- ;
19	shall be s	subject to an administrative fine imposed by the
20	commission	n that shall not exceed \$500 for each violation of this
21	chapter.	All fines collected under this section shall be
22	deposited	into the general fund."

Report Title:

Lobbyists; Statement of Expenditures; Special Session

Description:

Requires persons who engage in lobbying ninety days prior to the convening of a special session or through sine die of that special session, or both, to file a statement of expenditures with the state ethics commission within ten days of sine die of that special session. Amends the definition of "lobbyist" to include persons who lobby in excess of five hours in any month during the ninety days prior to the convening of a special session or through sine die of that special session, or both, or who spend more than \$750 lobbying during that same period.
