## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SENTENCING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 706-659, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§706-659 Sentence of imprisonment for class A felony.
- 4 (1) Notwithstanding part II; sections 706-605, 706-606, 706-
- 5 606.5, 706-660.1, 706-661, and 706-662; and any other law to the
- 6 contrary, a person who has been convicted of a class A felony,
- 7 except [class A felonies defined in chapter 712, part IV, or
- 8 section 707-702, as provided in subsection (2), shall be
- 9 sentenced to an indeterminate term of imprisonment of twenty
- 10 years without the possibility of suspension of sentence or
- 11 probation. The minimum length of imprisonment shall be
- 12 determined by the Hawaii paroling authority in accordance with
- 13 section 706-669.
- 14 (2) A person who has been convicted of a class A felony
- 15 defined in chapter 712, part IV, or section 707-702, may be
- 16 sentenced to an indeterminate term of imprisonment, except as
- 17 provided for in section 706-660.1 relating to the use of
- 18 firearms in certain felony offenses and section 706-606.5

When ordering [such] a sentence, 2 the court shall impose the [maximum length] following terms of 3 imprisonment [which shall be]: 4 (1)For a class A felony defined in chapter 712, part IV--5 twenty years[-] or less, but not less than ten years; 6 and 7 (2) For a class A felony under section 707-702--twenty 8 years. The minimum length of imprisonment shall be determined by the 9 10 Hawaii paroling authority in accordance with section 706-669." 11 SECTION 2. Section 706-660, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is **12** amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows: 13 "(2) A person who has been convicted of a class B or class 14 C felony for any offense under part IV of chapter 712 may be 15 sentenced to an indeterminate term of imprisonment; provided that this subsection shall not apply to sentences imposed under 16 17 sections 706-606.5[-7] and 706-660.1[-712-1240.5, 712-1240.8]18 712-1242, 712-1245, 712-1249.5, 712-1249.6, 712-1249.7, and 712-19 <del>1257</del>1. **20** When ordering a sentence under this subsection, the court

shall impose a term of imprisonment which shall be as follows:

- 5 The minimum length of imprisonment shall be determined by the

- 7 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
