A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR INVASIVE SPECIES CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that immediate action is
- 2 needed to further protect Hawaii from invasive species. Act 85,
- 3 Session Laws of Hawaii 2003, created the invasive species
- 4 council for the special purpose of providing policy level
- 5 direction, coordination, and planning among state departments,
- 6 federal agencies, and international and local initiatives for
- 7 the control and eradication of harmful invasive species
- 8 infestations throughout the State and for preventing the
- 9 introduction of other invasive species that may be harmful.
- 10 The State's five island-based invasive species committees
- 11 protect Hawaii's forested watersheds, agriculture, tourism-based
- 12 economy, natural and cultural resources, and health and
- 13 lifestyle by preventing or stopping the spread of invasive
- 14 species over hundreds of thousands of acres. Collectively, the
- 15 committees are responsible for much of the on-the-ground
- 16 response and control work, and outreach and education across the
- 17 State. The committees are the only organizations that work
- 18 island-wide to address incipient invasive species across



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- 1 multiple jurisdictions, including state, federal, county, and
- 2 private lands. The committees have utilized and leveraged state
- 3 funding to: eradicate, contain, or prevent the establishment of
- 4 coqui frogs where feasible; contain or stop the spread of
- 5 miconia and more than thirty other invasive plant, vertebrate,
- 6 and invertebrate species; reduce or prevent the harm caused by
- 7 axis deer; and educate, engage, and involve the public in
- 8 detecting and reporting invasive species. These efforts help
- 9 avoid millions of dollars in future costs to Hawaii's
- 10 watersheds, real estate, and tourism industry. The committees
- 11 are projects of the University of Hawaii Pacific cooperative
- 12 studies unit.
- 13 Successful detection and control of invasive species
- 14 require consistent, repeat visits by highly trained staff to
- 15 infested areas often in inhospitable terrain, with some areas
- 16 accessible only by air. Many of the most harmful invasive
- 17 species take years to eradicate.
- 18 The legislature finds that increased funding from the State
- 19 is necessary to safeguard previous investments and ensure long-
- 20 term success. Federal sources have diminished and are expected
- 21 to decline significantly in future years. Maintaining the
- 22 invasive species council's momentum on the most harmful invasive



- 1 species will require an estimated \$8,000,000 each year from all
- 2 combined sources.
- The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to the 3
- invasive species council. 4
- 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$6,200,000 or so much 6
- thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the 7
- University of Hawaii Pacific cooperative studies unit to 8
- allocate to the invasive species committees for invasive species 9
- 10 response and control, and outreach and education related to
- invasive species; provided that any administrative, indirect 11
- cost charged by the University of Hawaii for the administration 12
- of this program shall not exceed six per cent per year of the 13
- 14 total amount appropriated.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of 15

Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 16
