A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in the United
2	States, more than one-fourth of children are left alone and
3	unsupervised after school. The majority of these children are
4	in elementary and intermediate school, at a time in life when
5	adverse behavior and health temptations are omnipresent.
6	To counter this problem in elementary school, the
7	legislature created the after-school plus program (A+ program)
8	more than a decade ago to provide children with a safe and
9	nurturing place to go after school. The A+ program has been
10	successful since its inception, with thousands of participants
11	in over one hundred eighty schools statewide. Approximately
12	two-thirds of A+ program sites are managed by third party
13	contractors, and one-third are managed by department of
14	education personnel.
15	The legislature further finds that for the past decade, as

evidence-based physical activity and nutrition education program, called Fun 5, has been operating successfully in nearly

- 1 program, providing training for all A+ program group leaders,
- 2 supplying manuals and play equipment, as well as hands-on
- 3 instruction for physically active games and healthy nutrition
- 4 support.
- 5 The Fun 5 program, which for many of the children is the
- 6 only organized physical activity they receive in a day, has
- 7 shown positive results in boosting children's level of physical
- 8 activity, curbing obesity and increasing consumption of fruits
- 9 and vegetables. It does this through a hands-on and enjoyable
- 10 program that promotes five servings of fruits and vegetables per
- 11 day, and at least thirty minutes of active physical exercise
- 12 five days a week.
- 13 The legislature finds that the kinds of physical and
- 14 nutrition activities in the Fun 5 program are and should be -
- 15 an integral part of the A+ program. Unfortunately, since the
- 16 establishment of the Fun 5 program a decade ago, nearly all
- 17 funding has come from private donations, a situation that has
- 18 become significantly more difficult to maintain.
- 19 The overall cost of implementing the Fun 5 program averages
- 20 approximately \$1 per child per month which covers the training
- 21 activities and equipment replenishment requirements for
- 22 afterschool activity. Given the vital importance of physical



- 1 activity and healthy eating to optimal childhood development and
- 2 obesity prevention, the legislature finds that it is equally
- 3 vital that funding for a nationally recognized, evidence-based
- 4 physical activity and nutrition program similar to Fun 5 be
- 5 institutionalized within the A+ program itself.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to establish a physical activity
- 7 and nutrition component within the A+ program and make an
- 8 appropriation to the department of education to support the
- 9 program.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "§302A- After-school plus program; physical activity and
- 14 nutrition. (a) The after-school plus program shall include a
- 15 nationally recognized, evidence-based physical activity and
- 16 nutrition component that provides physical exercise and
- 17 nutrition education to all participating students as an integral
- 18 part of the after-school plus program.
- 19 (b) The physical activity and nutrition component shall
- 20 include a process for taking biennial surveys of participating
- 21 fourth, fifth, and sixth graders that measures health risk

- 1 behaviors relating to chronic illness. The results of these
- 2 surveys shall be reported to the legislature and governor.
- 3 (c) The department may contract with a third party for the
- 4 organization, management, and implementation of the physical
- 5 activity and nutrition component required by this section.
- 6 (d) The department may establish, as part of any after-
- 7 school plus program participation fees, a fee sufficient to
- 8 maintain the physical activity and nutrition component at all
- 9 after-school plus programs in the State.
- 10 (e) The department and any third party on behalf of the
- 11 department, may accepts gifts and donations to assist with the
- 12 costs of implementing, managing, expanding, or improving the
- 13 physical activity and nutrition component required by this
- 14 section."
- 15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to
- 18 establish a physical activity and nutrition component within the
- 19 after-school plus program.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 21 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 22 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
