DEPARTMENT:

Business, Economic Development, and Tourism

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE, ENERGY, AND FOOD SECURITY TAX REPEAL DATE.

PURPOSE:

Enable a resource strategy aligned with the State's 2030 clean energy goals, as passed by the Legislature in Act 155, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, by amending the repeal date for the environmental response, energy, and food security tax (EREFST) from June 30, 2015, to June 30, 2030.

MEANS:

Amend Act 73, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2010, sections 10 and 14.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Legislature in enacting Act 73, SLH 2010, determined that it is essential to provide sustained support of Hawaii's energy and food security agenda. To succeed, the State must ensure a long-term strategy that is well-resourced and capable of building self-sufficiency in energy and food needs.

Impact on the public: Positive. Enables a resource strategy aligned with the State's 2030 clean energy goals, as passed by the Legislature in Act 155, SLH 2009.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Revenues would be provided from the EREFST to
the Departments of Health, Agriculture, and
Business, Economic Development, and Tourism
for many more years to perform duties intended
by Act 73, SLH 2010.
