## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNCLAIMED PROPERTY TRUST FUND.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 523A-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§523A-25 Agreement to locate property. (a) An agreement
- 4 by an owner, the primary purpose of which is to locate, deliver,
- 5 recover, or assist in the recovery of property that is presumed
- 6 abandoned shall be void and unenforceable if it was entered into
- 7 during the period commencing on the date the property was
- 8 presumed abandoned and extending to a time that is twenty-four
- 9 months after the date the property is paid or delivered to the
- 10 administrator.
- 11 (b) An agreement by an owner, the primary purpose of which
- 12 is to locate, deliver, recover, or assist in the recovery of
- 13 property shall be enforceable only if the agreement is in
- 14 writing, clearly sets forth the nature of the property and the
- 15 services to be rendered, is signed by the apparent owner, and
- 16 states the value of the property before and after the fee or
- 17 other compensation has been deducted.

Unclaimed Property Trust Fund

## Description:

Amends section 532A-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to reduce the maximum fee cap for non-attorney, professional finders from twenty-five per cent to ten per cent. Requires a person entering into an agreement with the owner or claimant to locate unclaimed property to notify the owner or claimant, prior to entering into the agreement, that the State does not impose a fee for filing a claim for unclaimed property.
