A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES ADULT FOSTER HOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 321-11.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§321-11.2 Adult foster homes. (a) The department of		
4	health is authorized to certify adult foster homes for		
5	individuals with developmental [disabilities] or intellectual		
6	disabilities requiring [such] care beyond the individual's		
7	eighteenth birthday. "Adult foster home" means a private family		
8	home providing care on a twenty-four hour basis [for] to adults		
9	with developmental or intellectual disabilities. To be		
10	certified, an adult foster home shall [have]:		
11	(1) House not more than two adults with developmental or		
12	intellectual disabilities at the same time[, who are		
13	unrelated to the foster family.]; and		
14	(2) Not have a certified caregiver who is:		
15	(A) A legal guardian of a foster adult;		
16	(B) A trustee of a foster adult; or		
17	(C) Related to a foster adult.		

1	For the purposes of this subparagraph, "related"			
2	means related by blood, related by marriage, or			
3	have a legal relationship between the certified			
4	caregiver and the foster adult.			
5 .	The director of health may waive the two-adult limit for			
6	certification of that home as an adult foster home; provided			
7	that the number of adults with developmental or intellectual			
8	disabilities in the certified home shall not exceed three adults			
9	with developmental or intellectual disabilities.			
10	(b) To accommodate residents of a foster boarding home for			
11	children with developmental or intellectual disabilities who			
12	reach the age of eighteen years, where the home is defined as a			
13	foster boarding home under section 346-16 and certified as a			
14	foster boarding home for children under section 346-17, the			
15	director of health may waive the two-adult limit for			
16	certification of that home as an adult foster home $[\tau]$; provided			
17	that:			
18	(1) [the] The total number of foster children with			
19	developmental or intellectual disabilities and adults			
20	with developmental or intellectual disabilities in			
21	such \underline{a} dually certified home shall not exceed [five,]			
22	three; and			

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1	(2) $[\frac{no}{no}]$ No new adults and children may be admitted into			
2	the home [while there are any foster children residing			
3	in the home].			
4	This subsection shall not affect the validity of the			
5	certification of any adult foster home that is defined as a			
6	foster boarding home under section 346-16, certified as a foster			
7	boarding home for children under section 346-17, and in			
8	existence as of the effective date of this Act.			
9 ,	[(b)] <u>(c)</u> The rules of the department of human services			
10	adopted under authority of section 346-17, which prescribe the			
11	standards of conditions and competence of operation of child			
12	foster boarding homes shall apply to adult foster homes.			
13	Notwithstanding chapter 91, to the contrary, the rules shall be			
14	considered adopted by the department of health on July 1, 1986,			
15	for the purpose of regulating adult foster care homes and shall			
16	be valid until the department of health adopts rules pursuant to			
17	chapter 91. The department of health shall adopt rules pursuant			
18	to chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of this section.			
19	$\left[\frac{(c)}{(d)}\right]$ Rate of payment for adult foster homes is to be			
20	determined on the same basis as domiciliary care homes as			
21	provided under section 346-53."			

1 Section 346-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 2. 2 amended to read as follows: "\$346-17 Child placing organizations, child caring 3 institutions, and foster boarding homes; authority over, 4 5 investigation of, and standards for. (a) No child placing 6 organization shall engage in the investigation, placement, and 7 supervision of minor children in foster care unless it meets the standards of conditions, management, and competence set by the 8 9 department of human services. 10 No child caring institution shall receive minor 11 children for care and maintenance unless it meets the standards 12 of conditions, management, and competence to care for and train children set by the department. 13 No foster boarding home shall receive for care and 14 15 maintenance any child unless: It meets with the standards of conditions, management, 16 (1) 17 and competence set by the department; and The foster boarding home applicant successfully 18 (2) completes foster parent training; provided that after 19 July 1, 1999, new special licensed or relative foster 20 home care providers licensed for a specific child or

children shall successfully complete foster parent

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1		training within the first year following placement of
2		the first child into the new special licensed or
3		relative foster home.
4	(d)	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
5	91 relati	ng to:
6	(1)	Standards for the organization and administration of
7		child placing organizations;
8	(2)	Standards of conditions, management, and competence
9		for the care and training of minor children in child
10		caring institutions and foster boarding homes; and
11	(3)	Standards of conditions and competence of operation of
12		foster boarding homes as may be necessary to protect
13		the welfare of children.
14	(e)	All rules of the department shall have the force and
15	effect of	law, and any violation thereof or of this section
16	shall be	punishable by a fine of not more than \$200.
17	(f)	As a condition for a certificate of approval, any
18	organizat	ion, institution, or foster boarding home, including
19	all adult	s residing in the foster boarding home, shall:
20	(1)	Meet all standards and requirements established by the
21		department;

1	(2)	Be subject to criminal history record checks in			
2		accordance with section 846-2.7, and child abuse and			
3		neglect registry checks, in accordance with			
4		departmental procedures; and			
5	(3)	Provide consent to the department or its designee to			
6		obtain criminal history record and child abuse and			
7		neglect registry information.			
8	New employees of the organization, institution, or home shall b				
9	fingerpri	nted within five working days of employment.			
10	(g)	Upon approval of the organization, institution, or			
11	foster boarding home, the department or its authorized agents				
12	shall issue a certificate of approval that shall continue in				
13	force for one year or for two years if the organization,				
14	institution, or foster boarding home meets the criteria				
15	established by the department, unless sooner revoked for cause.				
16	The certificate shall be renewed by the department or its				
17	authorized agents, after annual or biennial investigation, if				
18	the investigation discloses that the organization, institution,				
19	or foster boarding home continues to meet the standards set by				
20	the department. The certificate of approval shall be a permit				
21	to operate the child placing organization, child caring				
22	institution, or foster boarding home, and no person or				

- 1 organization shall operate or maintain the organization,
- 2 institution, or foster boarding home without the certificate.
- 3 (h) Any child placing organization, child caring
- 4 institution, or foster boarding home shall be subject to review
- 5 or investigation at any time and in a manner, place, and form as
- 6 may be prescribed by the department or its authorized agents.
- 7 (i) As used in this section, "foster parent training"
- 8 means training or instruction in special skills and knowledge to
- 9 care for foster children.
- (j) The department or its designee shall request:
- 11 (1) A criminal history record check through the Hawaii
- 12 criminal justice data center on all operators,
- employees, and new employees of child care
- 14 institutions, child placing organizations, and foster
- 15 boarding homes, including all adults residing in the
- 16 foster boarding homes, subject to licensure pursuant
- 17 to section 846-2.7; and
- 18 (2) A child abuse and neglect registry check on all
- operators, employees, and new employees of child care
- 20 institutions, child placing organizations, and adults
- 21 residing in a foster boarding home subject to
- licensure in accordance with departmental procedures.

- 1 (k) The department may deny a certificate of approval if
- 2 an operator, employee, or new employee of a child care
- 3 institution or child placing organization's facility, or any
- 4 adult residing in a foster boarding home, was convicted of a
- 5 crime other than a minor traffic violation involving a fine of
- 6 \$50 or less and if the department finds that the criminal
- 7 history record or child abuse registry history of an operator,
- 8 employee, new employee, or adult residing in a foster boarding
- 9 home poses a risk to the health, safety, or well-being of the
- 10 children in care.
- 11 (1) The department or its designee shall make a name
- 12 inquiry into the criminal history records for the first two
- 13 years of certification of a foster boarding home and annually or
- 14 biennially thereafter and into the child abuse and neglect
- 15 registry in accordance with departmental procedures depending on
- 16 the certification status of the home.
- 17 (m) The department shall not certify as a foster boarding
- 18 home any existing adult foster home that has been certified by
- 19 the director of health pursuant to section 321-11.2."
- 20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

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Report Title:

Developmental Disabilities Foster Homes

Description:

Prohibits legal guardians, trustees, and relatives from continuing to care for individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities in a certified foster home. Defines "related" as related by blood or marriage or having a legal relationship between a certified caregiver and a foster adult. Permits minors with intellectual or developmental disabilities to age in place under certain conditions. Clarifies that certified adult foster homes dually certified as foster boarding homes shall not exceed a total of three individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities. Does not impact the validity of certification of adult foster homes that are dually certified as foster boarding homes and in existence as of the effective date of this Act. Takes effect on 1/1/2050. (SD2)

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
