A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE USE OF TOBACCO AND E-CIGARETTES ON HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION PREMISES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the health
2	facilities within the Hawaii health systems corporation are
3	committed to providing quality health care for the people of
4	Hawaii and taking steps to reduce the occurrence of preventable
5	disease. Consistent with this commitment, the corporation must
6	not permit the use of tobacco and other potentially dangerous
7	substances on the campuses of its health facilities, as allowing
8	such use would not only expose vulnerable patients, employees,
9	and visitors to the perils of harmful substances, but would also
10	demonstrate a shortcoming in the corporation's goal of reducing
11	the occurrence of preventable disease.
12	The purpose of this Act is to protect patients, employees,
13	and all other visitors to the health facilities within the
14	Hawaii health systems corporation from exposure to second-hand
15	smoke and other potentially harmful substances as well as to
16	promote positive health practices by prohibiting any person from
17	using tobacco products or e-cigarettes on the premises of any

 tobacco-cessation programs available to public health facility

- 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 323F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 "§323F- Tobacco and e-cigarette use prohibited. (a)
- 8 Not withstanding any provision to the contrary in chapter 328J,
- 9 the use of any tobacco product or e-cigarette by any person on
- 10 the premises of all health facilities operated by the
- 11 corporation within the State is prohibited, to the extent not
- 12 preempted by federal law or regulation.
- 13 For the purposes of this section, "tobacco product" means
- 14 any substance containing tobacco leaf, including but not limited
- 15 to cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco, hookah tobacco, snuff,
- 16 chewing tobacco, dipping tobacco, bidis, blunts, clove
- 17 cigarettes, or any other preparations of tobacco; and any
- 18 product or formulation of matter containing biologically active
- 19 amounts of nicotine that is manufactured, sold, offered for
- 20 sale, or otherwise distributed with the expectation that the
- 21 product or matter will be introduced into the human body; but
- 22 does not include any cessation product specifically approved by

the United States Food and Drug Administration for the sole use 1 of treating nicotine or tobacco dependence. 2 "E-cigarette" means any electronic oral device, such as one 3 4 composed of a heating element, battery, or electronic circuit, or more than one of these, which provides a vapor of nicotine or 5 any other substances for inhalation. The term shall include any 6 such device, whether manufactured, distributed, marketed, or 7 8 sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, or under any other 9 product name or descriptor, but does not include any product 10 specifically approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for use in medical treatment, such as an asthma 11 12 inhaler. 13 "Tobacco or e-cigarette use" does not include mere possession or storage of the same for use in locations outside 14 the premises of the corporation's health facilities. 15 "Premises" means all indoor and outdoor areas within the 16 State-designated property boundary lines of each of the 17 18 corporation's health facilities and shall include all employee 19 and visitor parking lots. 20 (b) The corporation shall provide tobacco cessation programs for public employees who are interested in 21

participating at the corporation's health facilities; provided

- that issues relating to the costs of the program shall be 1 2 subject to collective bargaining. (c) Pursuant to section 89-9(d), the tobacco and e-3 cigarette use prohibitions under this section shall not be 4 5 subject to collective bargaining. 6 (d) The corporation shall be responsible for educating all health facility personnel, contractors, patients, and all other 7 visitors to the corporation's health facilities regarding the 8 prohibitions under this section. The corporation shall 9 10 prominently display signs stating that "tobacco and e-cigarette 11 use is prohibited" at all entrances to the corporation's health facilities and at other conspicuous locations throughout the 12 outdoor premises of each health facility." 13 14 SECTION 3. Section 89-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 15 16 Excluded from the subjects of negotiations are 17 matters of classification, reclassification, benefits of but not 18 contributions to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust 19 fund, recruitment, examination, initial pricing, and retirement
- 21 and the exclusive representative shall not agree to any proposal

benefits except as provided in section 88-8(h). The employer

15	(7)	Determine methods, means, and personnel by which the
16		employer's operations are to be conducted; [and]
17	(8)	Take such actions as may be necessary to carry out the
18		missions of the employer in cases of emergencies $[-]$:
19		and
20	(9)	In the case of the Hawaii health systems corporation,
21		prohibit the use of tobacco products and e-cigarettes
22		on the premises of all health facilities operated by
23		the corporation within the State.

1	This subsection shall not be used to invalidate provisions
2	of collective bargaining agreements in effect on and after June
3	30, 2007, and shall not preclude negotiations over the
4	procedures and criteria on promotions, transfers, assignments,
5	demotions, layoffs, suspensions, terminations, discharges, or
6	other disciplinary actions as a permissive subject of bargaining
7	during collective bargaining negotiations or negotiations over a
8	memorandum of agreement, memorandum of understanding, or other
9	supplemental agreement.
10	Violations of the procedures and criteria so negotiated may
11	be subject to the grievance procedure in the collective
12	bargaining agreement."
13	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE USE OF TOBACCO AND E-CIGARETTES ON HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION PREMISES.

PURPOSE:

To prohibit tobacco or e-cigarette use on Hawaii health systems corporation premises.

MEANS:

Add a new section to chapter 323F and amend 89-9(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Hawaii health systems corporation facilities are institutions where people receive treatment, heal, and recover from health conditions, and where residents receive long term care. This law will protect patients, employees, medical staff, and visitors from exposure to second-hand smoke and other potentially harmful substances and promote positive health practices by prohibiting any person from using tobacco products or electronic cigarettes on HHSC premises.

Impact on the public: The measure will protect patients, employees and all other visitors to the health facilities within the Hawaii health systems corporation from exposure to second-hand smoke and other potentially harmful substances as well as promote positive health practices by prohibiting any person from using tobacco products or e-cigarettes on the premises of any Hawaii health systems corporation facility and making tobacco-cessation programs available to public health facility employees.
