A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 171-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) The board of land and natural resources shall be 4 composed of seven members, one from each land district and three 5 at large, to be nominated and, by and with the advice and 6 consent of the senate, appointed by the governor as provided in 7 section 26-34. The term and removal of a member of the board 8 and the filling of a vacancy on the board shall also be as 9 provided in section 26-34. There shall be not more than three 10 members on the board from the same political party. At least 11 one member of the board shall have a background in conservation 12 and natural resources, as evidenced by:

13 (1) A college degree in a relevant field, including
14 forestry, wildlife conservation, geology,
15 environmental science, or marine biology; or
16 (2) Work history sufficient to demonstrate an appropriate

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Land and Natural Resources

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

PURPOSE: To amend the composition of the Board of Land and Natural Resources (Board) by requiring that at least one member shall have a background in native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices.

MEANS: Amend section 171-4(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: Native Hawaiian culture has knowledge that has been passed on for generations and is still practiced for the purpose of perpetuating traditional protocols, caring for and protecting the environment, and strengthening cultural and spiritual connections.

> Pursuant to various statutes, nearly all the boards and commissions under the jurisdiction of the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) require a member with a background in native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices. Currently however, the Board does not require that at least one member have a background in native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices.

> Incorporating at least one member with such a background on the Board would provide an opportunity for valuable knowledge of native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices to be included in decisions regarding resources of significance to the native Hawaiian culture.

<u>Impact on the public:</u> This bill would allow the public to benefit from knowledge of native Hawaiian traditional and customary Page 2



practices with regard to decisions affecting natural resources.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill would provide the Department with valuable knowledge of native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices with regard to decisions affecting natural resources.
