A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend or delete 2 any statutes or provisions containing federal requirements that are currently addressed in Hawaii Administrative Rules or 3 4 otherwise deemed unnecessary. SECTION 2. Section 286-207, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 6 amended to read as follows: Exemptions, certain vehicles. This part shall 7 "§286-207 not apply to the following vehicles, if such vehicles are in 8 9 compliance with safety ordinances and rules of the county in 10 which they operate and other applicable state safety laws and 11 rules: 12 [(1) The type of passenger carrying vehicle known as a "sampan bus" within a radius of twenty miles from the city of 13 14 Hilo, Hawaii; 15 (2) Station wagons for the carriage of property; 16 (3) (1) Trucks, truck-trailers, trailers, or other 17 nonpassenger carrying equipment having a gross vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or less, except vehicles used in 18

1 transporting material found by the United States Secretary of Transportation to be hazardous under 49 U.S.C. section 5103 and 2 3 transported in a quantity requiring placarding under 49 C.F.R., 4 Subtitle B, Chapter I, Subchapter C; 5 $\left[\frac{4}{4}\right]$ (2) Taxicabs as described in section 271-5(3)(B); 6 [(5) Passenger carrying vehicles with a seating capacity 7 of nine or less used for the transportation of employees to and 8 from the jobsite; 9 $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ (3) Passenger carrying vehicles used by employees 10 solely for their own transportation to, from, and during work; 11 [(7)] (4) Passenger carrying vehicles with a gross vehicle **12** weight of 10,000 pounds or less used in car or van pools to 13 transport less than sixteen individuals for the movement of 14 passengers to and from work; 15 $[\frac{(8)}{1}]$ (5) A passenger carrying vehicle used for the transportation, without compensation, of persons for [private,] 16 **17** personal, recreational, or entertainment purposes; 18 $[\frac{(9)}{}]$ (6) A passenger carrying vehicle with a gross 19 vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or less used solely for 20 the transportation, without compensation, of the vehicle owner, 21 the vehicle owner's family or guests;

8	(3) Be readily legible during daylight hours, from a
9	distance of fifty feet (15.24 meters) while the motor
10	carrier vehicle is stationary; and
11	(4) Be kept and maintained in a manner that retains the
12	legibility required by paragraph (3).
13	(d) The marking may be painted or permanently affixed on
14	the motor carrier vehicle.
15	(e) A motor carrier or company operating a motor carrier
16	vehicle under a rental agreement having a term in excess of
17	thirty calendar days shall meet the requirements of this
18	section.] "
19	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
20	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
21	begun, before its effective date.

there is a possibility for noncompliance to result when various legislative drafts are developed. To ensure exact compliance and avoid the possibility of a contradiction between rules and statutes, the department is deleting statutes and provisions of the HRS whenever they are addressed in administrative

rules or otherwise deemed unnecessary.

The statutes that are repealed by this bill are currently addressed in chapter 19-141, Hawaii Administrative Rules, or no longer needed in the Hawaii Revised Statutes.
