BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 706-659, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$706-659 Sentence of imprisonment for class A felony.
- 4 (1) Notwithstanding part II; sections 706-605, 706-606,
- 5 706-606.5, 706-660.1, 706-661, and 706-662; and any other law to
- 6 the contrary, a person who has been convicted of a class A
- 7 felony, except [class A felonies defined in chapter 712, part
- 8 IV, or section 707-702, as provided in subsection (2), shall be
- 9 sentenced to an indeterminate term of imprisonment of twenty
- 10 years without the possibility of suspension of sentence or
- 11 probation. The minimum length of imprisonment shall be
- 12 determined by the Hawaii paroling authority in accordance with
- 13 section 706-669.
- 14 (2) A person who has been convicted of a class A felony
- 15 defined in chapter 712, part IV, or section 707-702, may be
- 16 sentenced to an indeterminate term of imprisonment, except as
- 17 provided for in section 706-660.1 relating to the use of
- 18 firearms in certain felony offenses and section 706-606.5
