A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Wasmannia
- 2 auropunctata, commonly known as the little fire ant, threatens
- 3 native biodiversity, alters tropical ecosystems, impairs human
- 4 health, impedes tourism, diminishes agricultural productivity,
- 5 mars horticulture sales, and accordingly ranks among the world's
- 6 worst invasive species. Human behaviors and habitats allow the
- 7 little fire ant to move quickly, disperse widely, grow to high
- 8 densities, and inhabit locations not otherwise possible.
- 9 Hawaii's tropical climate is ideally suited for little fire
- 10 ant establishment and growth. As of 2013, the little fire ant
- 11 has been recorded on the islands of Kauai, Maui, Oahu, Lanai,
- 12 and Hawaii. The little fire ant has been successfully contained
- 13 on the island of Kauai and almost eradicated on the islands of
- 14 Maui and Lanai, but continues to move between islands on plants,
- 15 cut flowers, fruits, and other media. The ant now appears to be
- 16 established at several locations on the island of Oahu.
- 17 Additional research, new tools, and increased public awareness

- 1 are needed to stop the further spread and establishment of the
- 2 little fire ant.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the
- 4 development and implementation of additional tools to detect and
- 5 control the little fire ant and to create a statewide public
- 6 awareness and education campaign about the little fire ant.
- 7 SECTION 2. (a) The county of Hawaii's department of parks
- 8 and recreation shall implement a little fire ant pilot project.
- 9 The pilot project shall:
- 10 (1) Address the spread of the little fire ant within
- infested county parks;
- 12 (2) Test different types of pesticides for controlling and
- eradicating the little fire ant;
- 14 (3) Develop model strategies to eradicate the threat of
- 15 little fire ants that other counties can implement;
- 16 and
- 17 (4) Work in close collaboration with the Hawaii ant lab of
- 18 the Pacific cooperative studies unit of the University
- of Hawaii.
- 20 (b) The county of Hawaii may hire personnel necessary for
- 21 the little fire ant pilot project. The staff, at a minimum,

- 1 shall consist of one part-time caretaker II position and two
- part-time caretaker I positions.
- 3 (c) The little fire ant pilot project shall end on
- 4 June 30, 2015. The department shall submit a report to the
- 5 legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 6 the regular session of 2016, detailing findings and
- 7 recommendations, including proposed legislation, regarding the
- 8 pilot project.
- 9 SECTION 3. (a) The Hawaii ant lab of the Pacific
- 10 cooperative studies unit of the University of Hawaii shall
- 11 implement a canine detection team pilot project to assist in the
- 12 detection of new little fire ant populations and the eradication
- 13 of ant sites.
- 14 (b) The canine detection team pilot project shall end on
- 15 June 30, 2015. The Hawaii ant lab of the Pacific cooperative
- 16 studies unit of the University of Hawaii shall submit a report
- 17 to the legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the
- 18 convening of the regular session of 2016, detailing findings and
- 19 recommendations, including proposed legislation, regarding the
- 20 pilot project.
- 21 SECTION 4. The Hawaii invasive species council shall
- 22 implement a statewide public awareness and education campaign to

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- 1 assist in the prevention and eradication of little fire ants,
- 2 with an emphasis on testing and detecting the presence of the
- 3 invasive species in the media and materials moved by human
- 4 commerce and travel, including plants, soil, mulch, cinder,
- 5 vehicles, and equipment.
- 6 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to
- 9 establish the little fire ant pilot project, including hiring
- 10 the necessary personnel, pesticides, and equipment, to address
- 11 the little fire ant threat to Hawaii and develop strategies to
- 12 eradicate the little fire ant that can be implemented statewide.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of
- 14 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 17 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to
- 18 establish a canine detection team for statewide use to assist in
- 19 the detection of little fire ants.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 21 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

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- 1 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for a
- 4 statewide public awareness and education campaign on little fire
- 5 ants.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 7 invasive species council for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
