A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Wasmannia 2 auropunctata, known as the little fire ant, threatens native biodiversity, alters tropical ecosystems, impairs human health, 3 impedes tourism, diminishes agricultural productivity, mars 4 5 horticulture sales, and accordingly ranks among the world's worst invasive species. Human behaviors and habitats allow the 6 little fire ant to move quickly, disperse widely, grow to high 7 8 densities, and inhabit locations not otherwise possible. 9 Hawaii's tropical climate is ideally suited for little fire ant establishment and growth. As of 2013, the little fire ant 10 11 has been recorded on the islands of Kauai, Maui, Oahu, and 12 Hawaii. 13 The legislature further finds that research is needed to assess the long-term impacts of little fire ants in Hawaii and
- assess the long-term impacts of little fire ants in Hawaii and to ascertain the economic and social benefit from greater public investment in prevention and control.

- 1 develop model strategies to eradicate the threat of little fire
- 2 ants that can be implemented statewide.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) The county of Hawaii's department of parks
- 4 and recreation shall implement a little fire ant pilot project.
- 5 The pilot project shall:
- 6 (1) Address the spread of the little fire ants within
- 7 infested county parks;
- 8 (2) Test different types of pesticides for controlling and
- 9 eradicating the little fire ant; and
- 10 (3) Develop model strategies to eradicate the threat of
- 11 little fire ants that other counties can implement.
- 12 (b) The little fire ant pilot project shall end on
- 13 June 30, 2015. The department shall submit a report detailing
- 14 findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation,
- 15 regarding the pilot project to the legislature no later than
- 16 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- **17** 2016.
- 18 SECTION 3. The county of Hawaii shall have the authority
- 19 to hire personnel necessary for the little fire ant pilot
- 20 project. The staff, at a minimum, shall consist of one part-
- 21 time caretaker II position and two part-time caretaker I
- 22 positions.

- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$306,237 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for a
- 4 grant-in-aid to the county of Hawaii's department of parks and
- 5 recreation to establish a little fire ant pilot project,
- 6 including hiring the necessary personnel, pesticides, and
- 7 equipment, to address the little fire ant threat to Hawaii and
- 8 develop strategies to eradicate the little fire ant that can be
- 9 implemented statewide.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of
- 11 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
