A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DIABETES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§321- Diabetes reporting. (a) The department of
5	health, in collaboration with the department of human services
6	and department of human resources development, shall identify
7	goals and benchmarks and develop departmental plans to reduce
8	the incidence of diabetes in the State, improve diabetes care,
9	and reduce complications associated with diabetes.
10	(b) The department of health, in collaboration with the
11	department of human services and department of human resources
12	development, shall submit a biennial report to the legislature
13	no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
14	session in odd numbered years on the following:
15	(1) The health, societal, and financial impacts that
16	diabetes of all types has on the State, counties, and
17	the departments of health, human services, and human
18	resources development, including:

7		complications in Hawaii, including recommended

12	be limite	d to the diabetes information, data, initiatives, and			
13	programs within each department prior to the effective date of				
14	this Act, unless there is unencumbered funding for diabetes in				
15	each agen	cy that may be used for new research, data collection,			
16	reporting	, or other requirements of section 1 of this Act.
