A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an integrated camera 1 2 surveillance system operated by the state sheriffs will be an efficient and cost effective approach to assist in the security 3 of the historical capitol district. Strategically placed 4 cameras monitored by a central command center will support 5 roving patrols, stationed security, and law enforcement 6 7 personnel. The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 8 public safety to convene a working group to analyze the capitol 9 **10** district security infrastructure and develop a plan to create an integrated camera surveillance system to include the state 11 12 capitol, Washington Place, the governor's residence, 'Iolani Palace, the Hawaii state art museum, the main Hawaii state 13 library, the Kalanimoku and Aliiolani Hale buildings, and the 14 first district court. 15
- SECTION 2. (a) There is established in the department of public safety, for administrative purposes only, a working group that shall analyze the capitol district security infrastructure

and develop a plan, including a timeline and funding 1 2 requirements, to create an integrated camera surveillance 3 system. The working group shall be composed of: 4 (b) The director of public safety, or the director's 5 (1) 6 representative; 7 (2) The state comptroller, or the comptroller's representative; 8 The chief information officer, or the chief (3) 9 information officer's representative; 10 (4)The chief justice of the Hawaii supreme court, or the 11 chief justice's representative; 12 A member appointed by the senate president; 13 (5) 14 (6) A member appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and 15 (7) No more than two nongovernmental, private sector 16 experts or business persons knowledgeable in camera 17 and security surveillance, appointed by the governor. 18 The working group shall meet at least four times in 19 2014 and provide a report to the legislature no later than 20
