#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 2 working group to study the feasibility of implementing a
- 3 statewide online firearms registration process.
- 4 SECTION 2. (a) There is established an online firearms
- 5 registration working group, to be placed within the department
- 6 of the attorney general for administrative purposes, to study
- 7 the feasibility of implementing a statewide online firearms
- 8 registration process.
- **9** (b) In considering the feasibility of implementing a
- 10 statewide online firearms registration process, the working
- 11 group shall review the current firearms registration process,
- 12 concerns or problems with the current process, and methods to
- 13 address these concerns or problems in addition to an online
- 14 registration process.
- 15 (c) The attorney general or the attorney general's
- 16 designee shall serve as the chair of the working group, which
- 17 shall also include:
