A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO MANAGE ALBIZIA TREES ON THE ISLAND OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that albizia, Falcataria
- 2 moluccana, is an invasive species that presents an increasingly
- 3 costly threat to the economy, critical infrastructure, and
- 4 public safety on the island of Hawaii. The likelihood of
- 5 albizia trees falling and the long distances between residential
- 6 areas and emergency services add significantly to the
- 7 uncertainty of emergency response capability, resulting in the
- 8 potential loss of human life following a hurricane. Further,
- 9 the pre-planned removal of each albizia tree costs significantly
- 10 less than the combined direct and indirect costs of removal if
- 11 and when it falls into a road, power line, or building. The
- 12 Hawaii island invasive species committee has demonstrated the
- 13 effectiveness and necessity of a coordinated approach to
- 14 controlling the growth and spread of albizia trees.
- The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation for the
- 16 control of albizia trees on the island of Hawaii.

1	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general			
2	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much			
3	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the			
4	immediate, coordinated management of albizia trees that threaten				
5	access to critical emergency services and transportation routes				
6	identified by the Hawaii county civil defense agency for the				
7	island of	Hawaii, as follows:			
8	(1)	The funds shall be expended solely for the coordinated			
9		management of albizia trees on the island of Hawaii,			
10		except that other plants may be incidentally removed			
11		in the process. If the project cannot be continued,			
12		funds may be transferred to another island invasive			
13		species committee to accomplish the same purpose on			
14		that island;			
15	(2)	The majority of work shall be conducted within the			
16		heavily impacted district of Puna, albizia trees shall			
17		be completely removed from highway rights of way, and			
18		albizia trees outside the right of way that are deemed			
19		non-hazardous shall be treated and left in place.			
20		Trees shall be treated or removed to at least one			
21		hundred fifty feet from the road; and			

1	(3)	Cont	rol of albizia trees shall be concentrated in the		
2		following areas:			
3		(A)	The two-mile stretch of highway 132 between Lava		
4			Tree state park and Pahoa;		
5		(B)	Isolated patches of albizia trees between		
6			Kalapana and Pahoa;		
7		(C)	Isolated patches of albizia trees between Pahoa		
8			and Keaau; and		
9		(D)	The hospital corridor, particularly the segment		
10			of Waianuenue avenue from Komohana street to		
11			Akolea road, the segment of Akolea road from		
12			Waianuenue avenue to Kaumana drive, and Puainako		
13			street from highway 11 to Kaumana drive.		
14	SECT	ION 3	. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the		
15	University of Hawaii at Hilo, Pacific cooperative studies unit,				
16	for use by the Hawaii island invasive species committee for the				
17	purposes of this Act.				
18	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.

Description:

Makes an appropriation to the University of Hawaii at Hilo for the Hawaii island invasive species committee for the immediate, coordinated management of albizia trees on the island of Hawaii.

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
