A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal provisions 2 of Act 85, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, which allowed certain projects that may affect historic properties, aviation 3 artifacts, or burial sites to be reviewed in phases. 4 SECTION 2. Section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by repealing the definition of "programmatic agreement". 6 7 "["Programmatic agreement" means a document that sets forth the terms of a formal, legally binding agreement and establishes 8 9 a process for consultation, review, and compliance with federal 10 laws.]" SECTION 3. Section 6E-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§6E-8 Review of effect of proposed state projects. (a) 14 Before any agency or officer of the State or its political subdivisions commences any project which may affect historic 15
- subdivisions commences any project which may affect historic

 property, aviation artifact, or a burial site, the agency or

 officer shall advise the department and allow the department an

 opportunity for review of the effect of the proposed project on

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- historic properties, aviation artifacts, or burial sites, 1 consistent with section 6E-43, especially those listed on the 2 Hawaii register of historic places. The proposed project shall 3 not be commenced, or if it has already begun, continued, until 4 5 the department has given its written concurrence. [If: (1) The proposed project consists of corridors or large 6 7 land areas; Access to properties is restricted; or 8 9 (3) Circumstances dictate that construction be done in 10 stages, 11 the department may give its written concurrence based on a phased review of the project; provided that there shall be a 12 programmatic agreement between the department and the project 13 applicant that identifies each phase and the estimated timelines 14 15 for each phase. The department shall provide written concurrence or non-16 17 concurrence within ninety days after the filing of a request. with the department. The agency or officer seeking to proceed 18 with the project, or any person, may appeal the department's 19 concurrence or non-concurrence to the Hawaii historic places 20 review board. An agency, officer, or other person who is 21 22 dissatisfied with the decision of the review board may apply to
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- 1 the governor, who may take action as the governor deems best in
- 2 overruling or sustaining the department.
- 3 (b) The department of Hawaiian home lands, prior to any
- 4 proposed project relating to lands under its jurisdiction, shall
- 5 consult with the department regarding the effect of the project
- 6 upon historic property or a burial site.
- 7 (c) The State, its political subdivisions, agencies, and
- 8 officers shall report to the department the finding of any
- 9 historic property during any project and shall cooperate with
- 10 the department in the investigation, recording, preservation,
- 11 and salvage of the property.
- 12 [(d) The department shall adopt rules in accordance with
- 13 chapter 91 to implement this section.] "
- 14 SECTION 4. Section 6E-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "S6E-42 Review of proposed projects. (a) Before any
- 17 agency or officer of the State or its political subdivisions
- 18 approves any project involving a permit, license, certificate,
- 19 land use change, subdivision, or other entitlement for use,
- 20 which may affect historic property, aviation artifacts, or a
- 21 burial site, the agency or office shall advise the department
- 22 and prior to any approval allow the department an opportunity



for review and comment on the effect of the proposed project on 1 historic properties, aviation artifacts, or burial sites, 2 consistent with section 6E-43, including those listed in the 3 4 Hawaii register of historic places. [If: -(1) The proposed project consists of corridors or large 5 6 land areas; 7 (2) Access to properties is restricted; or 8 (3) Circumstances dictate that construction be done in 9 stages, 10 the department's review and comment may be based on a phased 11 review of the project; provided that there shall be a programmatic agreement between the department and the project 12 13 applicant that identifies each phase and the estimated timelines 14 for each phase.] The department shall inform the public of any project 15 16 proposals submitted to it under this section that are not 17 otherwise subject to the requirement of a public hearing or 18 other public notification. [(c) The department shall adopt rules in accordance with 19

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chapter 91 to implement this section.] "

1	SECTION 5	. This	Act	does	not	affect	rights	and	duties	that
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- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
