A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAND EXCHANGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in December of 2012,
3	the State purchased 1,750 acres of agricultural land in central
4	Oahu. Surrounding these lands are approximately twenty thousand
5	acres of agricultural and conservation lands owned by Dole Food
6	Company, Inc. These lands have been listed for sale at
7	\$175,000,000.
8	The legislature further finds that there is a continuing
9	need to protect and preserve unique natural assets, both for the
10	enjoyment of future generations and to establish base lines for
11	environmental impact. The present system of preserves,
12	sanctuaries, and refuges must be strengthened, and additional
13	areas of land suitable for agriculture and preservation should
14	be set aside. These additional areas of land may contain rare
15	species of plants and animals, portions of the State's major
16	watershed areas, and prime agricultural lands.

The purpose of this part is to identify state-owned parcels 1 2 of land to exchange for certain parcels of conservation and 3 agricultural land currently owned by Dole Food Company, Inc. 4 SECTION 2. Exchange for Conservation Lands; Whitmore Project Facility Revenue Bond Special Fund; Dole Food Company; Kalaeloa Community Development District; Appropriation

Description:

Part I: Authorizes the State to exchange lands for certain agricultural and conservation lands owned by Dole Food Company, Inc. Part II: Expands the Kalaeloa community development district. Part III: Establishes the Whitmore project facility revenue bond special fund into which proceeds from revenue bonds shall be deposited for purchasing certain parcels of land from Dole Food Company, Inc. Appropriates funds to acquire certain Dole Food lands.
