## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL PENALTIES ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to allow a
- 2 prevailing private party plaintiff seeking injunctive relief
- 3 against a defendant for any violation of chapter 6E, Hawaii
- 4 Revised Statutes, or rules adopted pursuant thereto, to recover
- 5 reasonable attorney's fees and costs from the defendant,
- 6 including the State, its agencies, and political subdivisions.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 6E-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "S6E-13 Injunctive relief. (a) In addition to, and
- 10 without limiting the other powers of the attorney general and
- 11 without altering or waiving any criminal penalty, civil, or
- 12 administrative provisions of this chapter, the attorney general
- 13 shall have the power to bring an action in the name of the State
- 14 in any court of competent jurisdiction for restraining orders
- 15 and injunctive relief to restrain and enjoin violations or
- 16 threatened violations of this chapter.
- 17 (b) Any person may maintain an action in the trial court

- 1 likely to occur for restraining orders or injunctive relief
- 2 against the State, its political subdivisions, or any person
- 3 upon a showing of irreparable injury, for the protection of an
- 4 historic property or a burial site and the public trust therein
- 5 from unauthorized or improper demolition, alteration, or
- 6 transfer of the property or burial site.
- 7 (c) A prevailing private party plaintiff seeking
- 8 injunctive relief against a defendant for any violation of
- 9 chapter 6E, or rules adopted pursuant thereto, may recover
- 10 reasonable attorney's fees and litigation costs from the
- 11 defendant, including the State, its agencies, and political
- 12 subdivisions, by order of the court."
- 13 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
