A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SURCHARGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, unlike traditional telecommunication services, prepaid wireless telecommunications services are not sold or used pursuant to term contracts or
- 4 subscriptions, and monthly bills are not sent to consumers by
- 5 prepaid wireless telecommunication service providers or retail
- 6 vendors. Instead, purchases tend to be made on a "cash-and-
- 7 carry" or "pay-as-you-go" basis from retailers at a wide variety
- 8 of general retail locations. Nevertheless, prepaid wireless
- ${f 9}$ consumers have the same access to emergency 911 services from
- 10 their wireless devices as wireless consumers on term contracts,
- 11 and prepaid wireless consumers benefit from the ability to
- 12 access the 911 system by dialing 911, all without having to pay
- 13 the enhanced 911 surcharge imposed on wireless consumers on term
- 14 contracts.
- In order to ensure equitable contributions to the funding
- 16 of 911 systems from consumers of prepaid wireless
- 17 telecommunication services, the collection and payment
- obligation of charges to support enhanced 911 should be imposed SB LRB 14-0823.doc



- 1 upon the consumer's retail purchase of the prepaid wireless
- 2 telecommunication service and should be in the form of a single,
- 3 statewide charge that is collected once at the time of purchase
- 4 directly from the consumer.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 138-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 10 wireless telecommunications service that allows a caller to dial
- 11 911 to access the 911 system, requires payment in advance of

- 13 the number declines with use in a known amount."
- 14 2. By amending the definition of "prepaid connection" to
- 15 read as follows:
- ""Prepaid connection" means the sale of a communications
- 17 service other than a prepaid wireless telecommunications service
- 18 that is paid for in advance or sold in predetermined units of
- 19 which the number of units declines with use of the services."

- 5 (i) Each customer who is subject to this chapter shall be
- 6 liable to the State for the surcharge until it has been paid to
- 7 the communications service provider. Communications service
- 8 providers shall have no liability to remit surcharges that have
- 9 not been paid by customers. A communications service provider
- 10 or reseller shall have no obligation to take any legal action to
- 11 enforce the collection of the surcharge for which any customer
- 12 is billed. However, the board may initiate a collection action
- 13 against the customer. If the board prevails in such a
- 14 collection action, reasonable attorney's fees and costs shall be

- 17 appropriate, the board may meet to make recommendations to the

- 19 discontinued, continued as is, or amended.
- 20 (k) When considering whether to discontinue, continue as
- 21 is, or amend the fund or surcharge, the board's recommendations

- 1 shall be based on the latest available information concerning costs associated with providing enhanced 911 service. 2 3 (1) A communications service provider or reseller shall 4 collect the surcharge on a prepaid wireless telecommunications 5 service connection from its customer at the time of the sale. 6 If a prepaid wireless telecommunications service connection is 7 transacted with the sale of one or more other products or 8 services for a single, non-itemized price, then the amount 9 specified in subsection (b) shall apply to the entire non-10 itemized price; provided that if a minimal amount of prepaid 11 wireless telecommunication service is sold with a prepaid **12** wireless device for a single, non-itemized price, then the 13 communications service provider or reseller may elect not to 14 apply the amount specified in subsection (b) to the prepaid 15 connection. For purposes of this subsection, an amount of service denominated as ten minutes or less, or \$5 or less, is 16
