A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SURCHARGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an increasing number
of telecommunications customers in Hawaii are opting for prepaid
wireless telecommunications service plans. This new business
model has resulted in the reduction of revenue to support the
statewide 911 system, which is essential for public safety.
Despite that prepaid wireless telecommunications service

7 plans include access to 911 services, the 911 surcharge is not 8 imposed on these plans. Instead, this service for consumers of 9 prepaid wireless telecommunications service plans is effectively 10 subsidized by consumers of postpaid wireless and land line 11 telecommunications service plans who pay the monthly 911 12 surcharge.

Consumers of prepaid wireless telecommunications service plans represent approximately twenty per cent of the consumer market in Hawaii, according to the telecommunications industry. This number is expected to increase as more carriers in a competitive marketplace employ this new business model of prepaid wireless telecommunications service plans.

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1 Without the collection of the 911 surcharge from prepaid 2 wireless telecommunications service plans, an important funding 3 mechanism to assist state and local governments in sustaining 4 the statewide 911 system and to provide for the deployment of 5 new and emerging 911 technologies will be severely impacted. 6 The purpose of this Act is to provide fair and equitable 7 funding of the statewide 911 system by establishing an E911 8 surcharge similar to the enhanced 911 surcharge imposed on 9 postpaid wireless communications services to be imposed on each 10 retail transaction of a prepaid wireless telecommunications 11 service. 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 138, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 14 and to read as follows: 15 Prepaid wireless E911 surcharge. (a) A prepaid "§138-16 wireless E911 surcharge of cents shall be imposed on each 17 retail transaction of prepaid wireless telecommunications 18 The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge is the liability service. 19 of the consumer and not of the seller or provider. 20 The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge shall be collected (b) 21 by the seller from the consumer with respect to each retail 22 transaction occurring within the State. The amount of the



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1	prepaid w	vireless E911 surcharge shall be separately listed on an
2	invoice,	receipt, or other similar document that is provided to
3	the consu	mer by the seller or shall be otherwise disclosed to
4	the consu	mer.
5	(c)	A retail transaction shall be treated as occurring
6	within th	e State if it is:
7	(1)	Transacted in person by a consumer at a seller's
8		business location within the State; or
9	(2)	A retail transaction that is treated as occurring in
10		the State for purposes of the tax imposed pursuant to
11		section 237-13.8; provided that if no tangible
12	·	personal property is shipped and the billing address
13		of the consumer or the consumer's payment instrument
14		is not known, the transaction shall be treated as
15		occurring within the State if the consumer's mobile
16		telephone is associated with an address within the
17		<u>State.</u>
18	(d)	A seller may deduct and retain three per cent of
19	prepaid w	rireless E911 surcharges collected from consumers. The
20	seller sh	all remit the balance of prepaid wireless E911
21	surcharge	s collected from consumers, including all surcharges
22	<u>collected</u>	where the amount of the surcharge has not been
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1	separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or other similar
2	document provided to the consumer by the seller, to the
3	department. The department may require sellers to remit the
4	balance of the surcharges collected electronically and shall
5	establish registration and payment procedures.
6	(e) The amount of the prepaid wireless E911 surcharge that
7	is collected by a seller from a consumer, if the amount is
8	separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or other similar
9	document provided to the consumer by the seller, shall not be
10	included in the base for measuring any tax, fee, surcharge, or
11	other charge that is imposed by the State, any political
12	subdivision of the State, or any intergovernmental agency.
13	(f) If a minimal amount of prepaid wireless
14	telecommunications service is sold with a prepaid wireless
15	device for a single, non-itemized price, the seller may elect
16	not to apply the surcharge imposed in subsection (a) to the
17	transaction. For purposes of this subsection, a "minimal
18	amount" means service of ten minutes or less or \$5 or less.
19	(g) The audit and appeal procedures applicable to
20	retailers, pursuant to chapter 237, shall apply to prepaid
21	wireless E911 surcharges.



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1	(h) The department shall establish procedures by which a
2	seller of prepaid wireless telecommunications service may
3	document that a sale is not a retail transaction, which
4	procedures shall coincide with the procedures for documenting
5	sale for resale transactions, pursuant to chapter 237.
6	(i) Section 138-9 shall apply to providers and sellers.
7	(j) No provider or seller shall be liable for damages to
8	any person resulting from or incurred in connection with the
9	provision of any lawful assistance to any investigative or law
10	enforcement officer of the United States or any political
11	subdivision, in connection with any lawful investigation or
12	other law enforcement activity by such law enforcement officer.
13	(k) The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge imposed by this
14	section shall be the only funding obligation imposed on prepaid
15	wireless telecommunications service in the State for enhanced
16	911 services. No other tax, fee, surcharge, or other charge for
17	enhanced 911 services shall be imposed by the State, any
18	political subdivision of the State, or any intergovernmental
19	agency, upon any provider, seller, or consumer with respect to
20	the sale, purchase, use, or provision of prepaid wireless
21	telecommunications service."



1	SECTION 3. Section 138-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding nine new definitions to be appropriately
3	inserted and to read as follows:
4	""Board" means the enhanced 911 board.
5	"Consumer" means a person who purchases prepaid wireless
6	telecommunications service in a retail transaction.
7	"Department" means the department of accounting and general
8	services.
9	"Prepaid wireless E911 surcharge" means the surcharge that
10	is required to be collected by a seller from a consumer in the
11	amount established under 138
12	"Prepaid wireless telecommunications service" means a
13	wireless telecommunications service sold in predetermined units
14	or dollars that decline with use in a known amount and allows a
15	caller to dial 911 to access the 911 system, a service that
16	shall be paid for in advance.
17	"Provider" means a person that provides prepaid wireless
18	telecommunications service pursuant to a license issued by the
19	Federal Communications Commission.
20	"Retail transaction" means the purchase of prepaid wireless
21	telecommunications service from a seller for any purpose other
22	than resale.
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1	"Seller" means a person who sells prepaid wireless
2	telecommunications service to another person.
3	"Wireless telecommunications service" means commercial
4	mobile radio service as defined by title 47 Code of Federal
5	Regulations section 20.3."
6	SECTION 4. Section 138-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	"§138-3 Enhanced 911 fund. There is established outside
9	the state treasury a special fund, to be known as the enhanced
10	911 fund, to be administered by the board. The fund shall
11	consist of amounts collected under [section] sections 138-4[$-$]
12	and 138 The board shall place the funds in an interest-
13	bearing account at any federally insured financial institution,
14	separate and apart from the general fund of the State. Moneys
15	in the fund shall be expended exclusively by the board for the
16	purposes of ensuring adequate funding to deploy and sustain
17	enhanced 911 service, developing and funding future enhanced 911
18	technologies, and funding expenses of administering the fund."
19	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
21	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

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Report Title: Prepaid Wireless; Enhanced 911 Surcharge

Description: Establishes an unspecified prepaid wireless E911 surcharge imposed on retail transactions of prepaid wireless telecommunications service at the point of sale. Allows sellers to deduct and retain three per cent of the surcharge that is collected. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB3103 HD1)
