A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SURCHARGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 138, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"S138- Prepaid wireless E911 surcharge. (a) A prepaid
5	wireless E911 surcharge of 66 cents shall be imposed on each
6	retail transaction of prepaid wireless telecommunications
7	service. The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge is the liability
8	of the consumer and not of the seller or provider.
9	(b) The prepaid wireless E911 surcharge shall be collected
10	by the seller from the consumer with respect to each retail
11	transaction occurring within the State. The amount of the
12	prepaid wireless E911 surcharge shall be separately listed on an
13	invoice, receipt, or other similar document that is provided to
14	the consumer by the seller; or otherwise disclosed to the
15	consumer.
16	(c) A retail transaction that is transacted in person by a
17	consumer at a seller's business location shall be treated as

- 1 the State or for any retail transaction that is treated as 2 occurring in the State for purposes of the tax imposed pursuant to section 237-13.8; provided that if no tangible personal 3 4 property is shipped and the billing address of the consumer or 5 the consumer's payment instrument is not known, the transaction 6 shall be sourced to the State if the consumer's mobile telephone 7 is associated with an address within the State. 8 (d) A seller may deduct and retain three per cent of 9 prepaid wireless E911 surcharges collected from consumers. The 10 seller shall remit the balance of prepaid wireless E911 11 surcharges collected from consumers, including all surcharges 12 collected where the amount of the surcharge has not been 13 separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or other similar 14 document provided to the consumer by the seller, to the 15 department. The department may require sellers to remit the 16 balance of the surcharges collected electronically and shall 17 establish registration and payment procedures. 18 (e) The amount of the prepaid wireless E911 surcharge that 19 is collected by a seller from a consumer, if the amount is 20 separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or other similar 21 document provided to the consumer by the seller, shall not be 22 included in the base for measuring any tax, fee, surcharge, or

1 other charge that is imposed by the State, any political 2 subdivision of the State, or any intergovernmental agency. 3 (f) If a minimal amount of prepaid wireless 4 telecommunications service is sold with a prepaid wireless 5 device for a single, non-itemized price, the seller may elect 6 not to apply the surcharge imposed in subsection (a) to the 7 transaction. For purposes of this subsection, a "minimal amount" means service of ten minutes or less or \$5 or less. 8 9 (g) The audit and appeal procedures applicable to 10 retailers, pursuant to chapter 237, shall apply to prepaid 11 wireless E911 surcharges. 12 The department shall establish procedures by which a 13 seller of prepaid wireless telecommunications service may 14 document that a sale is not a retail transaction, which 15 procedures shall coincide with the procedures for documenting 16 sale for resale transactions, pursuant to chapter 237. 17 (i) Within thirty days of receipt and for use in 18 accordance with the purposes of chapter 138, the department 19 shall transfer all remitted prepaid wireless E911 surcharges to 20 the enhanced E911 fund pursuant to section 138-3; provided that 21 the department may retain up to two per cent of the remitted

- 1 ""Consumer" means a person who purchases prepaid wireless 2 telecommunications service in a retail transaction. 3 "Department" means eHawaii.gov. 4 "Prepaid wireless E911 surcharge" means the surcharge that 5 is required to be collected by a seller from a consumer in the 6 amount established under 138- . 7 "Prepaid wireless telecommunications service" means a 8 wireless telecommunications service sold in predetermined units 9 or dollars that decline with use in a known amount and allows a 10 caller to dial 911 to access the 911 system, a service that 11 shall be paid for in advance. 12 "Provider" means a person that provides prepaid wireless telecommunications service pursuant to a license issued by the 13 14 Federal Communications Commission. 15 "Retail transaction" means the purchase of prepaid wireless 16 telecommunications service from a seller for any purpose other **17** than resale. "Seller" means a person who sells prepaid wireless 18 19 telecommunications service to another person. 20 "Wireless telecommunications service" means commercial 21 mobile radio service as defined by title 47 Code of Federal 22 Regulations section 20.3."

SECTION 3. Section 138-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§138-3 Enhanced 911 fund. There is established outside 4 the state treasury a special fund, to be known as the enhanced 5 911 fund, to be administered by the board. The fund shall 6 consist of amounts collected under [section] sections 138-4[-] 7 and 138- . The board shall place the funds in an interest-8 bearing account at any federally insured financial institution, 9 separate and apart from the general fund of the State. Moneys 10 in the fund shall be expended exclusively by the board for the 11 purposes of ensuring adequate funding to deploy and sustain 12 enhanced 911 service, developing and funding future enhanced 911 13 technologies, and funding expenses of administering the fund." 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2015.

Prepaid Wireless; Enhanced 911 Surcharge

Description:

Establishes a prepaid wireless E911 surcharge of 66 cents per retail transaction of prepaid wireless telecommunications service at the point of sale; allows sellers to deduct and retain three per cent of the surcharge that is collected; allows eHawaii.gov to retain up to two per cent of remitted surcharges to cover administrative costs; and requires the remaining amounts collected by eHawaii.gov to be placed in the enhanced 911 fund. Effective January 1, 2015. (SD1)
