A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds the University of Hawaii
- 2 college of engineering has been offering engineering programs
- 3 since 1908. Engineering is at the core of dynamic economic
- 4 sectors including renewable energy, island sustainability,
- 5 transportation, communication, security, military support,
- 6 manufacturing, and construction. The engineering industry
- 7 generates approximately six per cent of the State's gross
- 8 domestic product.
- 9 The legislature further finds that the college of
- 10 engineering is vital to the supply of the engineering workforce
- 11 that will live and work in the State. Over the past thirty
- 12 years, college of engineering graduates have generated more than
- 13 30,000 engineering related jobs for the State. The engineering
- 14 workforce is critical to resolving the future challenges of the
- 15 State including developing renewable energy systems, medical
- 16 devices, safe water supplies, and energy efficient
- 17 transportation systems; increasing recycling efforts and

- 1 remanufacturing imported products; improving agricultural,
- 2 information technology, and health delivery systems; alleviating
- 3 the effects of global warming and sea level rise by rebuilding
- 4 the State's costal infrastructure; assisting in securing the
- 5 State during natural and manmade disasters; the exploration of
- 6 the ocean and space; and generating a diversified economy based
- 7 on new and emerging technological opportunities.
- 8 The legislature additionally finds that since 2006,
- 9 engineering and pre engineering enrollment at the college has
- 10 increased by over fifty per cent, and the college of
- 11 engineering's competitive research expenditures have doubled
- 12 since 2004. Students participate in many projects related to
- 13 building and diversifying the State's economy in areas
- 14 including: aerospace, manufacturing, building drones and
- 15 associated communication systems, building and competing
- 16 internationally with robots, building and competing nationally
- 17 with civil engineering structures, and building surface and
- 18 underwater autonomous vehicles. College of engineering students
- 19 and faculty regularly compete and place in entrepreneurial
- 20 challenges at the University of Hawaii and nationally. Three
- 21 times in the last decade, the school has produced the top
- 22 electrical engineering student in the United States.

- 1 The legislature also finds that the college of engineering
- 2 has been occupying Holmes Hall since 1972. Holmes Hall, built
- 3 forty-two years ago, was designed to meet a very different style
- 4 of student engagement and teaching. Holmes Hall's current
- 5 maintenance and repair bill is \$18,000,000 and indicates the
- 6 need to do a complete renovation to provide for new laboratory
- 7 environments for teaching and research, new project space for
- 8 students to experiment with hands-on project work, and new
- 9 classroom environments, increasing the effectiveness of teaching
- 10 tomorrow's engineers.
- 11 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 12 funds to the University of Hawaii college of engineering for the
- 13 design and renovation of Holmes Hall.
- 14 SECTION 2. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 15 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
- 17 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2014-2015
- 18 for the design and renovation of Holmes Hall.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 20 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 21 SECTION 3. The appropriation made for the capital
- 22 improvement project authorized by this Act shall not lapse at



- 1 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is
- 2 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation
- 3 unencumbered as of June 30, 2016, shall lapse as of that date.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
