A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES PERSONNEL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's higher
2	education institutions frequently deny admission to veterans of
3	the United States armed forces due to a lack of immunization
4	records. The immunization process is lengthy and costly for
5	veterans, as the process requires a ticker test for measles,
6	mumps and rubella, and it can take several weeks to obtain the
7	test results and to receive the immunization record. However,
8	all service members who are discharged from the military receive
9	a DD Form 214, certificate of release or discharge from active
10	duty, and this certificate is used by the State's higher
11	education institutions to determine veterans' benefits. This
12	certificate may also provide the State's higher education
13	institutions with evidence that a veteran applicant has obtained
14	mandatory measles, mumps, and rubella shots, as it is a
15	requirement for active duty United States armed forces
16	personnel. Therefore, the legislature finds that authorizing
17	United States armed forces active duty personnel and veterans to
18	present a proof of service card or DD Form 214 in lieu of the
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- 1 vaccination and immunization requirements for admission to any
- 2 higher education institution in the State.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is provide a vaccination and
- 4 immunization exception to veterans and active duty members of
- 5 the United States armed forces who are applying to the State's
- 6 higher education institutions, under certain conditions.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 325-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "§325-34 Exemptions. (a) Section 325-32 shall be
- 10 construed not to require the vaccination or immunization of any
- 11 person for three months after a duly licensed physician,
- 12 physician assistant, or an authorized representative of the
- 13 department of health has signed two copies of a certificate
- 14 stating the name and address of the person and that because of a
- 15 stated cause the health of the person would be endangered by the
- 16 vaccination or immunization, and has forwarded the original copy
- 17 of the certificate to the person or, if the person is a minor or
- 18 under guardianship, to the person's parent or guardian, and has
- 19 forwarded the duplicate copy of the certificate to the
- 20 department for its files.
- 21 (b) No person shall be subjected to vaccination,
- 22 revaccination or immunization, who shall in writing object

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    thereto on the grounds that the requirements are not in
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    accordance with the religious tenets of an established church of
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    which the person is a member or adherent, or, if the person is a
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    minor or under guardianship, whose parent or guardian shall in
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    writing object thereto on such grounds, but no objection shall
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    be recognized when, in the opinion of the director of health,
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    there is danger of an epidemic from any communicable disease.
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         (c) United States armed forces active duty personnel and
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    veterans shall be granted a medical exemption from any
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    vaccination and immunization requirements for admission to a
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    higher education institution in the State upon the showing of a
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    proof of service identity card or a DD Form 214, certificate of
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    release or discharge from active duty. If at any time, there is
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    a danger or presence of an outbreak from any communicable
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    disease for which vaccination or immunization is required
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    pursuant to this chapter, the exemption shall not be recognized,
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    and inadequately vaccinated or immunized students shall be
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    excluded from the State's higher education institutions until
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    the presence or danger of the outbreak no longer exists."
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         SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
