### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN BURIALS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended SECTION 1. 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: "§6E− Relocation of Native Hawaiian remains with unknown 4 provenience. (a) It is the policy of the State to care for 5 6 inadvertently discovered Native Hawaiian human remains in 7 culturally appropriate ways. The preference for remains found at a burial site is for those remains to stay in place. If 8 9 remains must be removed, the owner of the land from which the 10 remains were found shall provide a burial site on the property 11 from which the remains were found. However, in cases where no provenience is known, such as when human remains are returned 12 13 from abroad; where remains cannot be returned to the initial 14 burial site and are not assigned an alternative burial site by 15 the department; or in other special situations as determined by 16 the department, notwithstanding sections 6E-6, 6E-43, 6E-43.5, and 6E-43.6 to the contrary, Native Hawaiian remains in the 17 possession of the department, or any state or county agency, 18 2013-0522 SB SMA-1.doc
