RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN BURIALS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established within the department

- 3 (c) The working group shall create a process to select and
  4 reinter Native Hawaiian remains in the possession of the State,
  5 whose provenience is unknown, or in other special circumstances,
  6 on the island of Kahoʻolawe. The working group shall determine
  7 the annual costs of such a reinterment process, including the
- 8 costs of reinterment and monitoring and stewardship of the
  9 burial area.
- (d) The members of the working group shall serve without
  compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
  travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 13 (e) The working group shall submit a report of its
  14 findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than
  15 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
  16 2015.
- 17 (f) The working group shall be dissolved on June 30, 2015.
