BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 663, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§663- Exemption for providing shelter and subsistence
5	to animals in need. (a) Any charitable or nonprofit
6	organization that in good faith provides shelter or proper means
7	of subsistence to any animal in need of aid as part of its bona
8	fide and customary charitable activities, rendered without
9	remuneration or expectation of remuneration, shall be exempt
10	from civil liability for injuries and damages resulting from the
11	organization's acts or omissions in providing shelter or
12	subsistence, except for gross negligence or wanton acts or
13	omissions of the organization.
14	(b) Any person who donates goods, food, materials, or
15	services to a charitable or nonprofit organization described
16	under subsection (a) shall be exempt from civil liability for
17	injuries and damages resulting from the donation, except for

gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions."
