BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$387-2 Minimum wages. (a) Except as provided in section
4 387-9 and this section, every employer shall pay to each
5 employee employed by the employer, wages at the rate of not less

6 than:

7 (1) \$6.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2003;

8 (2) \$6.75 per hour beginning January 1, 2006; [and]

9 (3) \$7.25 per hour beginning January 1, 2007[-];

10 (4) \$8.25 per hour beginning July 1, 2013;

11 (5) \$8.75 per hour beginning July 1, 2014 and ending on

12 June 30, 2015; and

13 (6) An amount adjusted in accordance with subsection (c)
14 beginning July 1, 2015.

15 (b) The hourly wage of a tipped employee may be deemed to 16 be increased on account of tips if the employee is paid not less 17 than 25 cents below the applicable minimum wage by the

1	receives from the employee's employer and in tips is at least 50
2	cents more than the applicable minimum wage.
3	(c) On September 30, 2014, and on September 30 each year
4	thereafter, the department of labor and industrial relations
5	shall calculate an adjusted minimum wage rate to maintain
6	employee purchasing power by increasing the current year's
7	minimum wage rate by the rate of inflation. The adjusted
8 -	minimum wage rate shall be calculated to the nearest cent using
9	the consumer price index for urban wage earners and clerical
10	workers, CPI-W, or a successor index, for the twelve months
11	prior to September 1 of each year as calculated by the United
12	States Department of Labor. Each adjusted minimum wage rate
13	calculated under this subsection shall take effect on the
14	following July 1."
15	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
