A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that during the tsunami 2 warning issued in Hawaii on October 27, 2012, several homes that
- 3 had been evacuated were burglarized. Due to such occurrences,
- 4 the legislature also finds that people may not evacuate or may
- 5 be reluctant to during a civil defense emergency out of fear
- 6 that their homes may be burglarized.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to provide further deterrence to
- 8 crimes of burglary during a civil defense emergency or disaster
- 9 relief period.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 708-817, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:
- "(2) Burglary of a dwelling during a civil defense
- 13 emergency or disaster relief period is a class A felony. A
- 14 person convicted under this section shall be sentenced to a
- 15 mandatory minimum jail sentence of not less than three years."
- 16 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 17 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 18 begun before its effective date.
