### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATEWIDE BAN ON SELLING OR OFFERING TO SELL AQUATIC LIFE FOR AQUARIUM PURPOSES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§188- Selling of aquatic life for aquarium purposes
- 5 prohibited; penalties; fines. (a) It shall be unlawful for any
- 6 person at any time to knowingly or intentionally sell or offer
- 7 to sell, for aquarium purposes, aquatic life taken from any of
- 8 the waters within the jurisdiction of the State.
- 9 (b) This section shall not apply to a person exercising a
- 10 customary and traditional right for subsistence, cultural, or
- 11 religious purposes, subject to the right of the State to
- 12 regulate that right, including native Hawaiian gathering rights
- 13 and traditional cultural practices as authorized by law or as
- 14 permitted by the State pursuant to article XII, section 7, of
- 15 the Hawaii state constitution.

1	<u>(c)</u>	This section shall not apply to the taking of aquatic
2	life for	human consumption or for sale for human consumption,
3	including	the use of bait.
4	(d)	This section shall not prohibit special activity
5	permits a	llowed under section 187A-6; provided that the permit
6	issued is	for bona fide scientific or public display purposes.
7	<u>(e)</u>	Any person violating this section or any rule adopted
8	pursuant	to this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and:
9	(1)	For a first offense, shall be fined not more than
10		\$1,000 or thirty days' imprisonment, or both;
11	(2)	For a second offense within five years of a previous
12		violation, shall be fined not more than \$2,000 or
13		sixty days' imprisonment, or both; and
14	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
15		of a previous violation, shall be fined not more than
16		\$3,000 or ninety days' imprisonment, or both.
17	<u>(f)</u>	In addition to any other penalty imposed under this
18	section,	a person violating this section shall be subject to:
19	(1)	An administrative fine of not more than \$1,000 for
20		each aquatic life specimen sold;

- 8 (b) Except as prohibited by law, the permits shall be

- 12 department that the methods of capture, husbandry, and transport
- 13 are humane and will not result in substantial injury to or death

- 15 (c) It shall be illegal to sell or offer for sale any fish
- 16 and other aquatic life taken under an aquarium fish permit
- 17 [unless those fish and other aquatic life are sold alive for

- 19 The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 for
- 20 the purpose of this section.

#### Report Title:

Aquatic Life; Taking or Selling; Aquarium Permit

#### Description:

Establishes prohibitions, penalties, and fines for knowingly selling aquatic life for aquarium purposes taken from waters within the jurisdiction of the State. Requires an aquarium permit to take marine or freshwater nongame fish and other aquatic life for aquarium purposes. Imposes new standards for aquarium permit issuance determinations. Prohibits the sale or offering for sale of aquatic life taken under an aquarium fish permit, including for aquarium purposes.
