### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
- for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs. 2
- Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of Hawaiian 3
- 4 Affairs Appropriations Act of 2013".
- 5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
- 6 used in this Act:
- "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific 7
- program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of 8
- Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the 9
- 10 program.
- "Means of financing", or "MOF", means the source from which 11
- 12 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be
- expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act. 13
- Letter symbols following appropriations have the following 14
- 15 meanings:
- 16 **A**: General Funds
- 17 T:Trust Funds

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1	"Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent
2	positions authorized for a particular program during a specified
3	period or periods, as noted by an asterisk.
4	SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
5	be necessary to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
6	herein, are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from
7	the sources of funding specified to the office of Hawaiian
8	affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and
9	ending June 30, 2015. The total general fund expenditures and
10	the number of permanent positions established in each fiscal
11	year of the biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position
12	ceiling indicated for each year, except as provided elsewhere in
13	this Act.

- 1 SECTION 4. Provided that the general fund appropriations
- 2 in section 3 of this Act shall be expended by the office of
- 3 Hawaiian affairs.
- 4 SECTION 5. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 5 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$400,000 in general
- 6 funds and \$400,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
- 7 the sum of \$400,000 in general funds and \$400,000 in trust funds
- 8 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for social services to
- 9 office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to include information
- 10 and referral services, case management and counseling,
- 11 establishment of individual development accounts, financial
- 12 literacy training, and financial assistance. Referral services
- 13 include those relating to education assistance, employment and
- 14 income security, individual and family care, health needs,
- 15 housing, legal services, genealogy research, business
- 16 assistance, and general information; provided further that
- 17 notwithstanding section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any
- 18 funds expended for the purposes of this section shall be in
- 19 accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 20 as appropriate.
- 21 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 22 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$750,000 in general

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- 1 funds and \$750,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
- 2 the sum of \$750,000 in general funds and \$750,000 in trust funds
- 3 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for educational
- 4 enrichment programs for Native Hawaiian children in grades K
- 5 through 12 throughout the State. Program activities are to be
- 6 designed to optimize learning for Hawaiian students and are
- 7 intended to develop a stronger interest in learning, connect
- 8 learning and education to one's Hawaiian identity, and explore
- 9 possible educational, career, and academic goals the students
- 10 may not have considered; provided further that any funds
- 11 expended for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance
- 12 with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a
- 13 competitive grants process, as appropriate.
- 14 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 15 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$524,400 in general
- 16 funds and \$524,400 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
- 17 the sum of \$524,400 in general funds and \$524,400 in trust funds
- 18 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for legal services and
- 19 legal representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries
- 20 for: the assertion and defense of quiet title actions;
- 21 assistance with ahupua'a and kuleana tenant rights, including
- 22 rights of access and rights to water, land title assistance,



- 1 including review of title and genealogy, preservation of 2 traditional and customary practices, protection of culturally 3 significant places, and preservation of Native Hawaiian land 4 trust entitlements; provided further that notwithstanding 5 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended 6 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with 7 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate. 8 SECTION 8. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 9 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$750,000 in general funds and \$750,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and 10 11 the sum of \$750,000 in general funds and \$750,000 in trust funds 12 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide for health improvement 13 services to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries, to include, but not necessarily be limited to, information and 14 15 referral services, case management and counseling, and the 16 establishment of prevention programs. Direct services and 17 prevention programs include those designed to have the greatest statewide impact on the overall wellness of Native Hawaiians 18 19 through targeted foci on the reduction of Native Hawaiian 20 chronic diseases rates, especially obesity. Through both prevention programs and direct services, significant gains could 21
  - be made for the most vulnerable and highest risk Native



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- 1 Hawaiians; provided further that any funds expended for the
- 2 purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter
- 3 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a competitive grants
- 4 process, as appropriate.
- 5 SECTION 9. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 6 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$250,000 in general
- 7 funds and \$250,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
- 8 the sum of \$250,000 in general funds and \$250,000 in trust funds
- 9 for fiscal year 2014-2015 shall provide leverage funding to the
- 10 office of Hawaiian affairs on behalf of its beneficiaries for
- 11 partnership with other entities and organizations on projects in
- 12 support of Kahua Waiwai (Economic Self Sufficiency), 'Āina (Land
- 13 & Water), Mauli Ola (Health), Ke Ea (Governance), and Ho'ona'auao
- 14 (Education); provided further that any funds expended for the
- 15 purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter
- 16 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a grants process, as
- 17 appropriate.
- 18 SECTION 10. Provided that whenever the need arises, the
- 19 board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or their
- 20 designee is authorized to transfer sufficient funds and
- 21 positions between programs for operating purposes; provided
- 22 further that these transfers shall not be inconsistent with



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- 1 legislative intent; and provided further that a report of these
- 2 fund transfers shall be made to the legislature no later than
- 3 the end of the 2014 and 2015 fiscal years.
- 4 SECTION 11. If any portion of this Act or its application
- 5 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
- 6 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
- 7 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
- 8 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
- 9 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
- 10 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
- 11 extent possible.
- 12 SECTION 12. In the event manifest clerical, typographical,
- 13 or other mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of
- 14 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs is hereby authorized
- 15 to correct such errors. All changes made pursuant to this
- 16 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next
- 17 session.
- 18 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
