### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ETHICS CODE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 84-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"§84	-13 Fair treatment. No legislator or employee shall
4	use or at	tempt to use the legislator's or employee's official
5	position	to secure or grant unwarranted privileges, exemptions,
6	advantage	s, contracts, or treatment, for oneself or others;
7	including	but not limited to the following:
8	(1)	Seeking other employment or contract for services for
9		oneself by the use or attempted use of the
10		legislator's or employee's office or position.
11	(2)	Accepting, receiving, or soliciting compensation or
12		other consideration for the performance of the
13		legislator's or employee's official duties or
14		responsibilities except as provided by law.
15	(3)	Using state time, equipment or other facilities for
16		private business purposes.
17	(4)	Soliciting, selling, or otherwise engaging in a
18		substantial financial transaction with a subordinate



1	or a person or business whom the legislator or
2	employee inspects or supervises in the legislator's or
3	employee's official capacity.
4	Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit a legislator
5	from introducing bills and resolutions, [or to prevent a person
6	<pre>from serving on a task force or from] serving on [a task force]</pre>
7	[committee, committees, or from making statements or taking
8	[official] action [as a legislator, or a task force member or a
9	task force member's designee or representative. Every
10	legislator, or task force member or designee or representative
11	of a task force member shall-file a full and complete public
12	disclosure of the nature and extent of the interest or
13	transaction which the legislator or task force member or task
14	force member's designee or representative believes may be
15	affected by the legislator's or task force member's official
16	action.] in the exercise of the legislator's legislative
17	functions.
18	Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit a member of a
19	task force from taking official action as a task force member."
20	SECTION 2. Section 84-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:

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1	"(f) Subsections (a), (b), and (d) shall not apply to a
2	task force member or the designee or representative of that task
3	force member whose service as a task force member would not
4	otherwise cause that member, designee, or representative to be
5	considered an employee[, if the task force member or the
6	designee or representative of that task force member complies
7	with the disclosure requirements under section 84-17]."
8	SECTION 3. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
10	"(c) The following persons shall file annually with the
11	state ethics commission a disclosure of financial interests:
12	(1) The governor, the lieutenant governor, the members of
13	the legislature, and delegates to the constitutional
14	convention; provided that delegates to the
15	constitutional convention shall only be required to
16	file initial disclosures;
17	(2) The directors and their deputies, the division chiefs,
18	the executive directors and the executive secretaries
19	and their deputies, the purchasing agents and the
20	fiscal officers, regardless of the titles by which the
21	foregoing persons are designated, of every state
22	agency and department;

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1	(3)	The permanent employees of the legislature and its
2		service agencies, other than persons employed in
3		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
4	(4)	The administrative director of the State, and the
5		assistants in the office of the governor and the
6		lieutenant governor, other than persons employed in
7		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
8	(5)	The hearings officers of every state agency and
9		department;
10	(6)	The president, the vice presidents, assistant vice
11		presidents, the chancellors, and the provosts of the
12		University of Hawaii and its community colleges;
13	(7)	The superintendent, the deputy superintendent, the
14		assistant superintendents, the complex area
15		superintendents, the state librarian, and the deputy
16		state librarian of the department of education;
17	(8)	The administrative director and the deputy director of
18		the courts;
19	(9)	The members of every state board or commission whose
20		original terms of office are for periods exceeding one
21		year and whose functions are not solely advisory;

1	(10)	Candidates for state elective offices, including
2		candidates for election to the constitutional
3		convention, provided that candidates shall only be
4		required to file initial disclosures; [and]
5	(11)	The administrator and assistant administrator of the
6		office of Hawaiian affairs[+]; and
7	(12)	Members of task forces."
8	SECT	ION 4. Section 84-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended b	y amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
10	"(d)	The financial disclosure statements of the following
11	persons s	hall be public records and available for inspection and
12	duplicati	on:
13	(1)	The governor, the lieutenant governor, the members of
14	·	the legislature, candidates for and delegates to the
15		constitutional convention, the trustees of the office
16		of Hawaiian affairs, and candidates for state elective
17		offices;
18	(2)	The directors of the state departments and their
19		deputies, regardless of the titles by which the
20		foregoing persons are designated; provided that with
21		respect to the department of the attorney general, the

1		foregoing shall apply only to the attorney general and
2		the first deputy attorney general;
3	(3)	The administrative director of the State;
4	(4)	The president, the vice presidents, the assistant vice
5		presidents, the chancellors, and the provosts of the
6		University of Hawaii;
7	(5)	The members of the board of education and the
8		superintendent, the deputy superintendent, the state
9		librarian, and the deputy state librarian of the
10		department of education;
11	(6)	The administrative director and the deputy director of
12		the courts; [and]
13	(7)	The administrator and the assistant administrator of
14		the office of Hawaiian affairs[-]; and
15	(8)	Members of task forces."
