## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

	DE II ENACTED DI THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.			
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Institute of			
2	Medicine has asserted that effective workforce planning and			
3	policymaking require better data collection and an improved			
4	information infrastructure. The legislature also finds mention			
5	in the Institute of Medicine's recommendations for building an			
6	"infrastructure for the collection and analysis of			
7	interprofessional health care workforce data" and collaboration			
8	amongst state licensing boards, state nursing workforce centers,			
9	and the Department of Labor in the effort to ensure that the			
10	data are timely and publicly accessible.			
11	The legislature further finds that the Hawaii center for			
12	nursing and the school of nursing and dental hygiene of the			
13	University of Hawaii have collaborated with the department of			
14	health, department of human services, department of commerce and			
15	consumer affairs, department of labor and industrial relations,			
16	Hawaii workforce development council, board of nursing, and all			
17	accredited schools of nursing in the State to ensure timely and			

publicly accessible data.

1	The legislature additionally finds that the center for	
2	nursing has collected nursing-related data through various	
3	surveys, including five annual surveys related to nursing	
4	programs, three biennial census surveys of registered nurses,	
5	and a census survey of licensed practical nurses. The	
6	legislature also finds that center for nursing surveys are a	
7	valuable way to collect important nursing-related data, and a	
8	response to these surveys should be required.	
9	Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to require:	
10	(1) The professional and vocational licensing division	of
11	the department of commerce and consumer affairs and	
12	the state board of nursing to collaborate with the	
13	center for nursing to enable the center to obtain	
14	nursing-related data;	
15	(2) The professional and vocational licensing division	to
16	provide the center for nursing with various	
17	information through a memorandum of understanding;	and
18	(3) The completion of a survey developed by the center	for
19	nursing as part of the license renewal requirements	
20	under chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes.	
21	SECTION 2. Section 304A-1407, Hawaii Revised Statutes,	is

amended to read as follows:

1	"[+]§304A-1407[+] Collaboration with the center for
2	nursing. (a) The University of Hawaii school of nursing and
3	dental hygiene, the state board of nursing, other schools of
4	nursing within the State, professional nursing organizations,
5	employers in the healthcare industry, and labor unions
6	representing nurses and healthcare workers shall collaborate
7	with the center for nursing and provide workforce data to the
8	center for nursing when requested.
9	(b) The professional and vocational licensing division of
10	the department of commerce and consumer affairs shall
11	collaborate with the center for nursing to enable the center for
12	nursing to obtain nursing-related data, including but not
13	limited to workforce data of nurses licensed in the State.
14	Workforce data may be obtained through online surveying or other
15	cost-effective, efficient methods. A survey developed by the
16	center for nursing and deemed necessary by the center for
17	nursing shall be required as part of the license renewal
18	requirements under section 457-9(a). Through a memorandum of
19	understanding with the center for nursing, the professional and
20	vocational licensing division shall:

1	(1)	Provide nurse ricensee contact information, including	
2		but not limited to email addresses, to the center for	
3		nursing for purposes of collecting and analyzing data;	
4	(2)	Prepare and disseminate written reports and	
5		recommendations regarding the current and future	
6		status and trends of the nursing workforce;	
7	(3)	Conduct research on best practices and quality	
8		outcomes;	
9	(4)	Develop a plan for implementing strategies to recruit	
10		and retain nurses; and	
11	(5)	Research, analyze, and report data related to the	
12		retention of the nursing workforce, in accordance with	
13		section 304A-1406.	
14	For	ourposes of compliance with this section, the center	
15	for nursi	ng shall abide by the requirements of chapter 92F."	
16	SECTION 3. Section 457-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
18	"(a)	The license of every person licensed, recognized, or	
19	granted p	rescriptive authority shall expire on June 30 of every	
20	odd-numbered year and shall be renewed biennially, except as		
21	provided in this section. Biennially in each odd-numbered year		
22	the board	shall make available an application for renewal of	

- 1 license before the deadline set forth by the board to every 2 person to whom a license was issued or renewed during the 3 biennium. The applicant shall complete the application and submit it to the board with a renewal fee and all required 4 documents on or before the deadline set by the board. 5 6 applicant shall provide documents from proper agencies or 7 parties of any criminal conviction or any disciplinary action 8 taken or pending in this State or any other state in the United States or any territory or possession under the jurisdiction of 9 10 the United States within the two years prior to application for 11 renewal of license. As part of the license renewal process, 12 each applicant shall be required to complete a survey developed 13 by the center for nursing as deemed necessary by the center for 14 nursing pursuant to section 304A-1407(b). Upon receipt of the 15 application and fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue to the applicant a certificate of renewal 16 for the biennium expiring two years hence on the deadline set by 17 18 the board. The renewal shall render the holder thereof a legal 19 practitioner of nursing for the period stated on the renewal
