#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- The legislature finds that service members who 1 SECTION 1. 2 leave the military often experience delays in finding post-3 service employment. Transitioning service members leave the military with documented education, training, and experience 4 that can prepare them for civilian employment; however, this 5 documentation is not always used by state entities when 6 7 determining qualifications for an occupational license. The legislature further finds that the employment of 8 military veterans has been cited as a top priority by the 9 President of the United States and the United States Secretaries 10 11 of Defense and Veterans Affairs. The First Lady of the United 12 States has addressed this issue as well, as part of the Joining 13 Forces Initiative, which was established to raise awareness and encourage all sectors of society to recognize the service and 14 15 sacrifice of military veterans.
  - The legislature additionally finds that Act 248, Session
    Laws of Hawaii 2012, was one measure that demonstrated Hawaii's
    commitment to this nationwide effort. However, amendments to

4	members obtain licensure under specific circumstances by:		
5	(1)	Clarifying that licensing authorities shall consider	
6		relevant education, training, or service completed by	
7		service members;	
8	(2)	Permitting licensure by endorsement or licensure by	
9		reciprocity in certain situations for service members;	
10	(3)	Establishing procedures for service members to receive	
11		a license by endorsement or license by reciprocity;	
12	(4)	Permitting issuance of a temporary license if certain	
13		requirements are met; and	
14	(5)	Requiring the licensing authority to expedite	
15		consideration of the application and issuance of a	
16		license by endorsement, license by reciprocity, or	
17		temporary license to a qualified service member.

20		guard who has transitioned out of the military within
21		the previous six months and had been stationed in
22		Hawaii by a proper order of the United States



1	Department of Defense immediately prior to the service
2	member's honorable discharge.
3	(c) Unless otherwise provided by law, an applicant for
4	licensure by endorsement or licensure by reciprocity who is a
5	service member may demonstrate competency in a specific
6	profession or vocation as determined by the licensing authority
7	in lieu of a requirement that the applicant has worked or
8	practiced in that profession or vocation for a specified period
9	of time prior to the application for licensure by endorsement or
10	licensure by reciprocity.
11	(d) The licensing authority shall expedite consideration
12	of the application and issuance of a license by endorsement or
13	license by reciprocity to a service member who meets the
14	requirements of this section.
15	(e) If a service member holds a current license in another
16	state, district, or territory of the United States with
17	licensure requirements that the licensing authority determines
18	are equivalent to or exceed those established by the licensing
19	authority of this State, that service member shall receive a
20	license pursuant to applicable statutes or requirements of the
21	licensing authority of this State regarding licensure by

1	endorseme	nt or licensure by reciprocity; provided that the
2	service m	ember:
3	(1)	Has not committed an act in any jurisdiction that
4		would have constituted grounds for the limitation,
5		suspension, or revocation of a license; has never been
6		censured or had other disciplinary action taken; has
7		not had an application for licensure denied; or has
8		not refused to practice a profession or vocation for
9		which the service member seeks licensure;
10	(2)	Has not been disciplined by a licensing or
11		credentialing entity in another jurisdiction; is not
12		the subject of an unresolved complaint, review
13		procedure, or disciplinary proceeding conducted by a
14		licensing or credentialing entity in another
15		jurisdiction; and has not surrendered membership on
16		any professional staff in any professional
17		association, society, or faculty for another state or
18		licensing jurisdiction while under investigation or to
19		avoid adverse action for acts or conduct similar to
20		acts or conduct which would constitute grounds for
21		disciplinary action in this State;

1	(3)	Pays any fees required by the licensing authority of
2		this State; and
3	(4)	Submits with the application a signed affidavit
4		stating that application information, including
5		necessary prior employment history, is true and
6		accurate.
7	Upon rece	iving the affidavit, the licensing authority shall
8	issue the	license to the service member and may revoke the
9	license a	t any time if the information provided in the
10	application is found to be false.	
11	A se	rvice member who meets or exceeds the requirements of
12	this sect	ion shall not be required to take a national or
13	regional	exam prior to licensure by endorsement or licensure by
14	reciproci	ty.
15	(f)	The licensing authority shall issue to the service
16	member a	temporary license to allow the service member to
17	perform s	pecified services, under the supervision of a
18	professio	nal licensed by this State if appropriate, while
19	completin	g any requirements necessary for licensure in this
20	State; pr	ovided that a temporary license shall only be issued in
21	those pro	fessions where credentials, experience, or passage of a

- 1 national exam is substantially equivalent to or exceed those
- 2 established by the licensing authority of this State.
- 3 (g) The licensing authority shall expedite consideration
- 4 of the application and issuance of a license by endorsement,
- 5 license by reciprocity, or temporary license to a service member
- 6 who meets the requirements of this section.""

- 9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.

#### Report Title:

Military; Service Members; Professional and Vocational Licensing; Military Education, Training, or Service; Licensure

#### Description:

Clarifies that licensing authorities shall consider relevant education, training, or service completed by service members. Specifies which service members are subject to these provisions. Permits licensure by endorsement or licensure by reciprocity in certain situations for service members. Establishes procedures for service members to receive a license by endorsement or license by reciprocity. Permits issuance of a temporary license if certain requirements are met. Requires the licensing authority to expedite consideration of the application and issuance of a license by endorsement, license by reciprocity, or temporary license to a qualified service member.
