A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TUITION WAIVERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 304A-502, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[+]§304A-502[+] Power of regents to grant tuition
4	waivers. (a) The board of regents, or its designated
5	representatives, is authorized to grant, modify, or suspend
6	tuition waivers.
7	The board may:
8	(1) Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or any of the
9	other fees for graduate teaching and research
10	assistants;
11	(2) Enter into agreements with government and university
12	officials of any other state or foreign country to
13	provide for reciprocal waiver of the nonresident
14	tuition and fee differential;
15	(3) Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
16	selected students from Pacific and Asian jurisdictions
17	when their presence would be beneficial to the
18	university or the State;

1	(4) Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or	any of the	
2	other fees for students, resident or nonresident	dent; and	
3	(5) Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differ	ential for	
4	members in good standing of the following mi	litary	
5	units, regardless of their actual state of re	esidence:	
6	(A) The Hawaii national guard; and		
7	(B) The federal reserve components of the A	rmy, Navy,	
8	Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guare	d who	
9	attend drills with units located within	the	
10	State.		
11	The board shall determine the percentage of allowable tuition		
12	and fee waivers for financial need and other university	У	
13	priorities. These tuition waivers and waivers of the		
14	nonresident tuition and fee differential shall be aware	ded in	
15	accordance with guidelines established by the board.		
16	(b) The board of regents shall waive entirely the tuition		
17	fee and any other fees for a qualified student who is	a spouse	
18	or child of:		
19	(1) An eligible veteran or national guard member	who	
20	became totally disabled as a result of servi	ng in	
21	active federal military service; or		

1	(2)	An active or reserve member of the armed forces or
2		national guard who was killed while engaged in active
3		federal military service; provided that upon
4		remarriage, the surviving spouse of the armed services
5		or national guard member shall no longer be eligible
6		for the fee waivers provided under this subsection."
