A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL RELIEF FOR MILITARY RESERVE COMPONENT PERSONNEL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 636, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- and to read as follows: 3
- Extension of foreclosure. If at any time a lien 4 "§636−

- 17 designated and to read as follows:

2	member of the state military forces defaults upon any obligation
3	to make payments on a loan secured by a mortgage upon real
4	property owned by the member, and the member:
5	(1) Is a state resident;
6	(2) By virtue of military orders, is required to be and is
7	physically located outside of the United States for
8	not less than ninety consecutive days; and
9	(3) Whose ability to send and receive mail is
10	substantially reduced;
11	no proceeding may be commenced in any court to enforce the
12	obligation arising out of nonpayment until one year after the
13	member returns to the State."
14	SECTION 3. Chapter 667, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
16	and to read as follows:
17	"§667- Extension of foreclosure. If at any time a
18	member of a reserve component of any branch of the United States
19	armed forces defaults upon any obligation to make payments on a
20	loan secured by a mortgage upon real property owned by the
21	reserve component member, and the reserve component member:
22	(1) Is a state resident;

1	(2) By virtue of military orders, is required to be and is
2	physically located outside of the country for not less
3	than ninety consecutive days; and
4	(3) Whose ability to send and receive mail is
5	substantially reduced;
6	no proceeding may be commenced in any court, and no power of
7	sale foreclosure may be conducted under part I or part II, to
8	enforce the obligation arising out of nonpayment until one year
9	after the reserve component member returns to the State."
10	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties tha
11	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
12	begun before its effective date.
13	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
