A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is the ultimate
- 2 goal of good medicine to improve a patient's health by reducing
- 3 the amount of medication needed by that patient. However, the
- 4 current status quo may focus on a system of disease care, rather
- 5 than health care. The legislature further finds that if the
- 6 State's population was healthier, less money would need to be
- 7 spent on medication and expensive procedures to treat the
- 8 complications of chronic disease. One way to accomplish this is
- 9 to emphasize healthier lifestyle choices and overall health
- 10 through prevention. Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to
- 11 establish a public-private health insurer partnership to promote
- 12 a holistic approach to preventive health care.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 15 and to read as follows:
- 16 "§321- Public-private partnership. (a) There is
- 17 established within the department of health for administrative

4	(1)	Work to promote overall wellness in the State; and
5	(2)	Support and create incentives for health care
6		providers to promote preventive health care to their

9	<u>(c)</u>	The public-private partnership shall invite
10	participation from stakeholders with a background in:	
11	(1)	<pre>Health insurance;</pre>
12	(2)	Health care, including physicians, nurses, dentists,
13		physical therapists and occupational therapists;
14	(3)	Nutrition;
15	(4)	Fitness; and
16	(5)	Native Hawaiian cultural practices.
17	(d)	The public-private partnership shall be mutually
18	beneficia	l to stakeholders and consumers and shall be based upon
19	the following goals:	
20	(1)	Increased investment in education, nutrition, and
21		active living to promote long-term wellness and
22		healthy living; and



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1	(2) A tangible reduction in medication use in the State's		
2	population.		
3	(e) The public-private partnership shall seek multiple		
4	funding sources to meet its goals, including federal, state, and		
5	private funding."		
6	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.		
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
