#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 340E-4.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	department shall establish a program to conduct annual testing		
5	of water from water catchment systems [for lead and copper.].		
6	upon request by a resident of the property on which the water
