BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

12	"Child care article" means all products designed or
13	intended by a manufacturer to facilitate sleep, relaxation, or
14	the feeding of children or to help children with sucking or
15	teething.
16	"Phthalates" and "phthalate esters" refer to a group of

Beginning January 1, 6 7 2014, no person or legal entity shall manufacture, sell, or distribute any toy or child care article that is: 8 9 Intended for use by a child under three years of age (1)10 and contains bisphenol-A; (2) Contains di-2-ethyl hexyl phthalate, di-n-butyl 11 12 phthalate, or butyl benzyl phthalate in concentrations exceeding 0.1 per cent; or 13 14 (3) Intended for use by a child under three years of age, is small enough to be placed in a child's mouth, and 15 16 contains diisononyl phthalate, diisodecyl phthalate, 17 or di-n-octyl phthalate in concentrations exceeding 18 0.1 per cent. Alternatives to bisphenol-A and phthalates. 19 \$**321-**Manufacturers shall use the least toxic alternative when 20 21 replacing bisphenol-A and phthalates in accordance with this

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Report Title:

Children; Toxic Substances; Bisphenol-A; Phthalates; Packaging; Metals; Vinyl Intravenous Solution Bags; Vinyl Tubing; Hawaii Heath Systems Corporation

Description:

Prohibits the manufacture, sale, or distribution of child care products and toys for young children that contain bisphenol-A or phthalates beginning 1/1/2014. Requires manufacturers to choose safe alternatives. Prohibits the use of packages and packaging containing lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent chromium beginning 1/1/2014. Prohibits the Hawaii health systems corporation from purchasing and using vinyl intravenous solution bags and vinyl tubing beginning 1/1/2014.
