A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
 to read as follows:

 "PART . INFANT AND TODDLER SAFETY

 \$321- Short title. This part shall be known, and may be
 cited, as the Toxin-Free Keiki Act.

 \$321- Definitions. As used in this part, unless the

- 9 "Bisphenol-A" refers to an estrogen-mimicking endocrine
 10 disrupter chemical used in the production of epoxy resins and
 11 polycarbonate plastics.
- "Child care article" means all products designed or

 intended by a manufacturer to facilitate sleep, relaxation, or

 the feeding of children or to help children with sucking or

 teething.
- 16 "Phthalates" and "phthalate esters" refer to a group of 17 chemical compounds that are used mainly to plasticize food

containers, plastic wrap, toys, shampoos, perfumes, and beauty 1 2 products. 3 "Toy" means a product designed or intended by a 4 manufacturer to be used by children for recreational purposes. 5 Prohibition of manufacture, sale, or distribution §321-6 of certain toys and child care articles. Beginning January 1, 7 2014, no person or legal entity shall manufacture, sell, or 8 distribute any toy or child care article that is: 9 (1)Intended for use by a child under three years of age 10 and contains bisphenol-A; 11 (2) Contains di-2-ethyl hexyl phthalate, di-n-butyl phthalate, or butyl benzyl phthalate in concentrations 12 13 exceeding 0.1 per cent; or 14 Intended for use by a child under three years of age, (3) 15 is small enough to be placed in a child's mouth, and contains diisononyl phthalate, diisodecyl phthalate, 16 17 or di-n-octyl phthalate in concentrations exceeding 18 0.1 per cent. 19 Alternatives to bisphenol-A and phthalates. 20 Manufacturers shall use the least toxic alternative when

replacing bisphenol-A and phthalates in accordance with this

2	phthalates, pursuant to this part, with either:	
3	(1)	Carcinogens rated as A, B, or C by the United States
4		Environmental Protection Agency's list of chemicals
5		evaluated for carcinogenic potential; or
6	(2)	Reproductive toxicants that cause birth defects,
7		reproductive harm, or developmental harm as identified
8		by the United States Environmental Protection Agency."
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
10	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
11	and to read as follows:	
12	"§321- Packages and packaging containing metals. (a)	
13	Beginning January 1, 2014, no person or legal entity shall	
14	manufacture, sell, or distribute any package or packaging	
15	containing levels of lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent	
16	chromium present in excess of one hundred parts per million by	
17	weight.	
18	(b) This section shall apply only to lead, cadmium,	
19	mercury, and hexavalent chromium that has been intentionally	
20	introduced as an element during manufacturing or distribution.	
21	(c)	As used in this section:

"Package" means the immediate container or wrapping in 1 2 which any substance or item is contained for sale or use in the 3 State. "Packaging" means any material used to surround, brace, 4 5 cushion, coat, or hold any substance or item for use or sale in 6 the State." 7 SECTION 3. Chapter 323F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 9 and to read as follows: 10 "§323F- Procurement of vinyl intravenous solution bags and tubing prohibited. (a) Beginning January 1, 2014, the 11 12 corporation shall not purchase or use any vinyl intravenous solution bags or vinyl tubing for use in any health care 13 14 application. (b) As used in this section: 15 "Vinyl intravenous solution bags" means intravenous 16 17 solution bags containing any amount of polyvinyl chloride plastic for use in health care. 18 "Vinyl tubing" means tubing containing any amount of 19

polyvinyl chloride plastic for use in health care."

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Children; Toxic Substances; Bisphenol-A; Phthalates; Packaging; Metals; Vinyl Intravenous Solution Bags; Vinyl Tubing; Hawaii Heath Systems Corporation

Description:

Prohibits the manufacture, sale, or distribution of child care products and toys for young children that contain bisphenol-A or phthalates beginning 1/1/2014. Requires manufacturers to choose safe alternatives. Prohibits the use of packages and packaging containing lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent chromium beginning 1/1/2014. Prohibits the Hawaii health systems corporation from purchasing and using vinyl intravenous solution bags and vinyl tubing beginning 1/1/2014. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)
