BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§302A- Salaried teachers and teacher trainees in public
- 5 schools; cardiopulmonary resuscitation training and
- 6 certification. The board shall develop procedures for a
- 7 cardiopulmonary resuscitation training and annual certification
- 8 program that shall be required for all teachers and teacher
- 9 trainees in all public schools.
- 10 A teacher or teacher trainee who refuses to participate in
- 11 the cardiopulmonary resuscitation training and certification
- 12 program established pursuant to this section shall be discharged
- 13 for such refusal.
- 14 This section shall not apply to volunteers or other non-
- 15 remunerated personnel providing support services at individual
- 16 schools."
- 17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
